
District Two Director Mike Boock



On The Trails

Trying to predict the weather is never a for sure thing. I can't explain why we had record lows in mid to late September, combined with above average snowfall. Then early November hit and mother nature decided to have record highs to start the month. It was exciting to see some snow on the ground this early, but at the same time, a lot of work needed to get done where that week of 70-degree temperatures and up came at the perfect moment.

Hopefully most clubs are finished or close to finish signing the trails and taking advantage of the snow melting in parts of the state. I know of a few clubs who knocked out their whole trail system their first out-

ing and contacted me right away, which I appreciate. The sooner we can get out to inspect, the sooner, and hopefully warmer it is for any corrections to be made. If you or any of the club members you have are involved with signing and would like to ride along, or you have a section that you consistently see comments from GFP, let me know and we can correct the confusion between us and club members. We want to make this important process as easy as possible, which will make the trails a safe enjoyable experience, and make your life as volunteers much easier.

As usual, Shannon are planning to distribute the new maps during the convention. It is important to pass these maps out to all businesses on the trail and your local chambers and snowmobile dealers. More maps can be requested by contacting me at Farm Island at 605-773-2885, or the Game Fish and Parks office in Watertown at 605-882-5200. We hope to have the maps in house around late November.

I haven't received all equipment and Grant-in-Aid agreements for the upcoming season yet, so if you haven't had a chance to sign those, please do so and send those in. I've already sent some grant request paperwork out to various clubs and continue to get that paperwork out as time allows. Remember, clubs with state owned equipment are allowed a 25% advance on the total grant that was approved to help keep you operating as necessary. If your club voted in a new Grant-In-Aid coordinator, please make sure they contact me so I can catch them up on the procedures of the grant and go through the paperwork with them. Usually a 20-25 minutes conversation.

In closing I would like to introduce Seth Lorton, who recently became a certified Park Ranger in the Northeast Park Region, based out of Watertown. Seth is the 2nd ranger in this position that commits half of his time to the East River Snowmobile Program. Seth will also get involved in other aspects on the eastern side of the state including, map distribution, snowmobile education on and off the trails, and attending club meetings when time allows, and performing trail signing evaluations. I look forward to working with Seth over the years to make sure our trails stay safe.

Hopefully folks are getting through their groomers after sitting all summer and working through any issues that they found. Remember, the dealer for all state-owned equipment is now based out of Medford Oregon.

That's all for this month, so stay safe and get ready to start those engines.

Pandemic, Rally part of dealership's 60th

Rice's Rapid Motorsports celebrates anniversary milestone during Rai

The 60th anniversary for Rice's Rapid Motorsports in Rapid City, South Dakota, was bound to be a memorable year, but nobody could have anticipated a pandemic would shutter vast parts of the country's economy and despite public health concerns of a 'superspreader event,' over 450,000 riders would attend the 80th Sturgis Motorcycle Rally.

But, as second-generation owner Wade Rice says, "You got to take the good with the bad."

In a lot of ways, the success of the Sturgis Rally over the last eight decades has helped spur the growth of Rice's Rapid Motorsports, especially seeing that in the early 1960s rival dealer and motorcycle rally founder J.C. "Pappy" Hoel encouraged Don Rice to officially become a Honda motorcycle dealer.

Don Rice started in the 1950s by repairing motorcycles out of his garage while he retained his employment as a plumber. Soon he got a dedicated shop and started carrying Triumph and BSA motorcycles. By the time Honda rolled around "My dad said, 'While the Japanese bikes are less expensive, they never drip oil and are more reliable,'" Wade Rice recalled.

"It started out as a sideshow and just continued to grow into a bigger and bigger deal," he said.

In 2015, Honda recognized Rice's Rapid Motorsports for 50 years of being a Honda dealer and in 2018 the business moved into a 58,000-square-foot facility, finally giving the dealership "the superstore size to match our superstore volume," according to Wade Rice.

Having launched a local Honda riders club and off-road motorcycle club aimed at preserving and reclaiming trails that were set to be closed in the Black Hills and Mount Rushmore area some 30 years ago, Wade Rice said that the dealership has helped raise more than \$30,000 in charitable donations from its paying members.

"[With the off-road club] we were one of the last forces in the county that helped keep the trail system open. We work with government agencies, not against them and we participate in a lot of local events to keep people out there riding and having fun," Wade Rice said.

The move into the mammoth facility in 2018 happened for numerous reasons. One was to have a large showroom and an area upstairs for club meetings. The other was to have a massive parking area to be able to host Sturgis Rally events and allow manufacturers to bring in demo fleets to conduct test rides and connect con-

sumers directly with OEMs.

But that didn't happen this year because of the pandemic, with Honda, Triumph and KTM holding back scheduled factory trucks and demo fleets. Harley-Davidson even restricted staff from attending the rally in a professional capacity because of the company's existing travel ban.

"We usually do most of our marketing during the Rally as it is traditionally the biggest selling time of the year," Wade Rice said. "Having those trucks in our lot helps bring a lot of excitement even if we do not sell a ton of units during the Rally, it builds brand awareness."

The lack of factory trucks led to an estimated 25% decline of foot traffic, with sales narrowly beating out the numbers from August 2019. Safety protocols like temperature checks of customers were followed and parts sales performed well.

"People weren't coming into my store if they felt sick but they did come



with the intention to spend money and have fun," Wade Rice said. "The bars in downtown Sturgis is a different story and I don't know what people were doing."

While Rice's Rapid Motorsports still conducted test rides, it was done with its greatly diminished inventory that has been hampered by manufacturing delays and inconsistent order deliveries.

"Really, we sold all of our inventory before the Rally got here. It is a double-edge sword — you either have too little or too much," he said, adding if he was fully stocked, he believes the numbers would have greatly surpassed those of last year.

Despite a lackluster Rally year for Rice's Rapid Motorsports, the 60th anniversary year has been greatly beating expectations with August's numbers having already been shattered numerous times in the spring and early summer months.

In August, the Motorcycle Industry Council reported that off-highway motorcycle sales had increased by 50.3% in the first half of 2020, compared to the same period last year. Meanwhile dual-purpose motorcycle sales increased by 20.9% during the same period as on-highway motorcycle sales dipped 9.6%, leading to overall motorcycle gains of 6.4% compared to the first half of 2019.

"There is not a store that hasn't killed last year's numbers," Wade Rice said. "We will never duplicate what happened this year but still I want a return to normal where I know I have X amount of units coming in for customers."

He owes the impressive flourish of sales squarely on the pandemic shutting down opportunities for spending on airplane travel, resort vacationing and consumers staying home while trying to find family-oriented recreational activities.

"I have a big hope that this pandemic will wake up our industry and what I mean by that is that the manufacturers have talked to us for the last 25 to 30 years, saying our products are competing against all these other things and they said the only way to get consumer's money is to get the marketing out to grab those people. But now you see with all those other functions cancelled, we are having a major transition with people coming back to our stores," Wade Rice said.

With people now being able to justify motorcycle purchases, he said that OEMs need to further compete in the space, not slash marketing budgets or continue production delays.

"They need to punch it out and let people know we want their business. Whether that is Honda, Suzuki or any motorcycle manufacturer, they need to do a better job of bringing in volume to us and helping to promote a product," he said. "As soon as COVID-19 happened, everything grew and it is fun to see the industry pop back up, but that momentum needs to be followed up."




ACSA UPDATE






