Hello again snow lovers.


Since the last issue the Trails have opened and some have had the opportunity to go do some riding. However we do need more snow

As I think back on the 2020 Convention a lot of positive things came from being forced to do things differently due to a bad circumstance. I can truly say it was one of the better convention annual meetings I have attended. The best part is there was sharing of knowledge and experience among clubs of different things either they are experimenting with or presently doing. People from our club, the Town & Country Snowdrifters, commented that they greatly appreciated being able to watch the meetings via Zoom. They could follow along with the happenings of SDSA as they were occurring. This created better engagement of our membership at all levels.



Some of the things I personally took home and have shared within the club included the following:

- We have a new Forest Supervisor in the Black Hills, Jeff Tomak. As members we should take a moment to introduce ourselves when given the opportunity and thank the Forest Service and GF&P for the great trail system we get to enjoy in our state. Absolutely, one of the best trail systems in the nation!
- The Whetstone Valley Snowmobile Association demonstrated to the meeting attendees first-hand how they were utilizing Google Maps to mark and track their trail. Yes, it may take a bit to set-up at first but in the long run it could be a very useful tool, especially when new volunteers are helping you mark the trail. I hope they will continue to share more as they hone this technological tool.
- Attendees saw a demonstration of how the Trailbusters Snowmobile Club have developed a new tool that enables them to push trail rebar into the hard ground a lot easier.
- We learned that Ryan Raynor is going to be working with Kim Raap to develop a new trail signing guide, something that is much needed. Now that we are more adapted to using technology, maybe a state-wide Zoom training could be conducted simultaneously to get everyone on the same page at once?
- It was also shared that two clubs the Dakota Drifters Snowmobile Club and the Town and Country Snowdrifters are both trying out different packers behind the groomers to determine if one is better than the other to groom trails in eastern South Dakota. The Dakota Drifters are utilizing a packer with tires, similar to packers in road construction and the Town & Country Snowdrifters are using a packer that is a curved piece of poly that puts downward pressure on the snow as you pull it behind the groomer. More to come on which one works better.

Being in agriculture my whole life and married to a farmer, trial and error along with implementation of technology is what has continued to move things forward to feed a growing population more efficiently. Snowmobiling is no different. However, it is also good to learn from our mistakes and we need to keep taking two steps forward and continue to change and evolve.

Speaking of the past, New Years Eve Day, my hubby and I took a road trip over to Minnesota to purchase an old 440 Arctic Cat Cheetah. This was a sled that my husband first started to learn to ride on. That is until he learned one of those valuable lessons... you should not tie the throttle open as you try to start it, unless you are a fast runner in deep snow. 

Charity: Diane reported Of the clubs that reported, we totaled \$1,675.00 in donations to Major Charities, such as ACSA and Friends of Snowmobiling. We totaled \$15,462.00 to Local Charities such as SDSA, SDSU Veterans Ride, Governor's Ride, Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers, Sno Cross, Jakob Hohm Off Road Adventures, YETIS, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, NSU, Optimist Club, Salvation Army, Avalanche Classes, Local Scholarships, various local benefits, Parade of Lights, Fire Departments, Radar Runs, m Step Outside Youth Program, Safety Courses, Storybook Island, Stop the Bleed Program, Membership Drives, Modern Woodmen of American, Brookings Back Pack, Hobo Day Parade, Cancer Walks, City Street Dances and Fun Runs – to name just a few. We totaled 11,083 volunteer hours. Town and Country donated \$5,380.00 with Dakota Drifters next at \$3,125. Well this hasn't been the beginning of a snowmobile season that we all had hoped for. I'll get into more of that later but want to say Happy New Years to everyone. During this pandemic the holidays have meant something a little extra and I was fortunate to be with family, in a safe manner. I hope everyone reading this was too.

Unfortunately snow conditions haven't been very favorable so far for the 2020-2021 snowmobile season. While the hills have received a couple different snow events, a couple grooming shifts have gone out, but snow conditions are below average at the time I wrote this article. We hope these conditions will change in the near future, and a little birdy just told me February is supposed to bring above average snowfall!

As far as east river goes, conditions are similar, and in some instances worse. We've had a few clubs able to go out and groom, but snow conditions can change multiple times in the same mile on those systems so we are hopeful trail conditions will see some more snow soon out east as well.

With that being said, Shannon and I are still busy working on other projects related to the snowmobile program. I'm currently working on improvements to our trail signing guidelines and surplussing old equipment that just sits around. The money generated from the surplus of snowmobile related equipment goes back into the Snowmobile Program too.

Shannon, and his crew working out the kinks on equipment after sitting for months at a time, cutting firewood, along with many other administrative tasks he has. All in all, while we wait for more snow, Game Fish and Parks staff continue to work with the snowmobile program day in and day out.

On another disappointing note, due to South Dakota State University policies, we had to cancel the 3rd annual SDSU Veteran's Snowmobile Ride due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This was found out after our December 4th Advisory Council meeting where staff from the Veteran's Affairs office felt confident, the event would go on. While talking to Connie Johnson, I confirmed our commitment to this event in the future and promised her, this year's cancellation will not impact future events and that SDSA, GFP and the Advisory Council are committed to providing this opportunity for our current service men and women and our Veteran's.

Well, as I look back this report was pretty Debbie downer. One thing I've learned about snowmobilers, is even at low snow conditions times like these, you keep your heads up and know better snow conditions are ahead of us. I think that mentality is so important after 2020, and what we are still going through.

Happy New Years from everyone here at Game, Fish and Parks!

From the Treasurer Diane Hiles

For the Charity Report submitted in April 2020 for the reporting period of April 2019 to March 2020, we had 16 clubs reporting, including SDSA. This is up from 13 last year and from 12 and 8 the two previous years before that. (we are gaining!) These numbers include SDSA as a club as well to capture the scholarships we give out, our donations to ACSA and the volunteer time of the Board of Directors for the various functions and projects that we undertake throughout the reporting year.

Of the clubs that reported, we totaled \$1,675.00 in donations to Major Charities, such as ACSA and Friends of Snowmobiling. We totaled \$15,462.00 to Local Charities such as SDSA, SDSU Veterans Ride, Governor's Ride, Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers, Sno Cross, Jakob Hohm Off Road Adventures, YETIS, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, NSU, Optimist Club, Salvation Army, Avalanche Classes, Local Scholarships, various local benefits, Parade of Lights, Fire Departments, Radar



Runs, Step Outside Youth Program, Safety Courses, Storybook Island, Stop the Bleed Program, Membership Drives, Modern Woodmen of American, Brookings Back Pack, Hobo Day Parade, Cancer Walks, City Street Dances and Fun Runs - to name just a few. We totaled 11,083 Volunteer Hours. Town and Country donated \$5,380.00 with Dakota Drifters next at \$3,125. The highest volunteer hours were reported by Dakota Drifters with 3,054 with Town and Country Snowdrifters next at 2,332 hours.

V & V Insurance. Policies end May 1 and replacement policies are being worked on.


Trace talked about an APP for SDSA. He then was added to the website committee! An App could eliminate the website and website expense among other benefits.

- 3. Active snowmobiler who encourages and practices safe and responsible snowmobiling.
- 4. Participated in safety course where applicable. Kelly made a motion to change the SOPS to what is listed above. Second was made by Duane Duerr. Discussion was held and the hand vote recorded 3 ayes, 2 nays and one abstain. Motion carried.

2. TO CLARIFY AVAILABILITY OF REMOTE INTERVIEW:

SOP Page 29

Selection Process

The SDSA office sends out the Snowmobile of the Year nomination form along with a letter from the President on September 1st of each year. Clubs may nominate one person/family for each category. A nomination form for each person/family must be submitted to the SDSA office by November 1st of each year. As applications are received in the office they are sorted by category and three copies are made. An interview schedule is completed, and contestants are notified of their respective interview times to take place on Saturday of the convention. Personal attendance is highly encouraged. In the event a candidate is unable to interview on site, they may contact the SDSA office and request a remote option (phone, video, etc.). The decision to allow, and make accommodations for, a remote interview will be made in conjunction with host club.

Three judges will make up the judging panel and the number of panels needed will be determined based upon the number of

applications received. Judges are arranged by the Awards Committee working with the Executive Secretary and Host Club. Judges should be familiar with the Awards Program and have good communication skills to interact and interview the applicant(s). Copies of completed applications are provided to the judging panel in advance of the annual convention. The Awards Chairperson or his/her representative will oversee the interview process and see that all interviews are completed within the time allotted. Door monitors may be utilized to ensure the judging panel stays within the allotted interview schedule. A listing of the interview schedule will be posted outside the room where judging will take place and at other appropriate locations. Following the completion of the interview process, judges will determine the winners of each category and provide their scoring and selection to the Award Chairperson or his/her representative. Plaques, signed by the SDSA President, will be awarded to the winners at the banquet. Clothing size and name information will be obtained from the winners and will be presented at a later date.

Trace made the motion to approve the above change to the SOPS. Jon seconded the motion. Discussion revealed that unusual circumstances only but leave it up to judges to decide on the circumstances. Motion carried.

2022 Convention: No bids were received. Jon made a motion to extend bid application to February 1 so that we can review bids at Governor's Ride meeting. Mike seconded the motion. Motion carried.

District 1 – Discussion point of changing the districts across the state. Is there a need for a district 1 director? Sturgis is the only club in District 1. This was tabled.

President Greg Nordstrom declared the 51st Annual meeting to be in session at 9:02 a.m.

President Nordstrom appointed Sheridan LaFramboise and Lisa Watkins as tellers and registrars

Mary Anne Grabow, Secretary established a roll call of 49 club delegates and 6 directors for a total of 55 ballots that could be cast.

In attendance were: Black Hills Snowmobile Club, Dakota Drifters 1 by zoom, Dakota Trailblazers, Ditch Rippers, Driftbusters 2 in person and 3 by zoom, Hand County by zoom, Driftskippers, Mile High, Poinsett Pounders, Sturgis Sno Drifters, Sioux Falls Sno Trackers 2 by zoom, Town & Country, Trailbusters, Watertown Snowmobile Club, Whetstone Valley Snowmobile Association and the YETIS. Greg Nordstrom, Jon LaFramboise, Mike Boock, Kelly Weaver by zoom, Duane Duerr, Jason Shepherd, Trace Damm, Kirsten VanDenHemel by zoom, Diane Hiles and Mary Anne Grabow.

Financial report: Diane reviewed the financial reports. Town & Country made a motion to approve the financial reports and file them for review. Aberdeen Driftbusters seconded the motion. The motion carried.

President's Report: Greg thanked the BHSC for hosting the convention and thanked the hotel for their service. He also encouraged people to run for the elections so that our board positions can be filled.

Membership & Website: 616 club, 123 SDSA only, 22 legacy for a total of 761. Associates last year were 93 total. Not a lot of activity on the website until snow season begins!

Fundraiser: 35 tickets are not turned in yet. 20 are accounted for but the 15 are available. The results are WAY better than a normal year! THANK YOU!

Charity: 16 clubs reported including SDSA. We are getting better at doing the reporting! We reported \$1675 to major charities, \$15,462 to local charities, and 11,083 volunteer hours. Town & Country and Dakota Drifters were at the top of the pack for their efforts.

International Snowmobile numbers totaled were \$464,262 with 221,252 volunteer hours. SD ranked 5th in clubs reporting! BYLAWS/RIGHT TO RIDE: Jon gave a short report but focused on whether we should re-district which clubs are in which district. That would take a bylaw change.

Convention: The Convention Committee includes Kelly Weaver, Mike Boock and Trace Damm. I would like to thank Mike and the Black Hills Snowmobile Club for their flexibility and extra efforts to provide safe accommodations for attendees, on top of the usual hard work a convention requires. We have worked

together to provide meetings on a virtual platform for remote attendees as well as interviews for Snowmobiler of the Year candidates. Following convention, we will provide the host club with the Convention Report which was created last year to collect data for use in future convention planning. Thank you all of you who have attended, donated auction items, made cash contributions or even donated your registration fees.

The 2021 Convention will be hosted by the Trailbusters in Mitchell and we will hear from them later in the meeting. We have not received any bids for the 2022 Convention at this point. The board has agreed to extend the deadline to February 1st and review bids at the Governor's Ride meeting on February 12th.

Scholarship: Scholarship Committee includes Kelly Weaver, Trace Damm and Duane Duerr. Each year, SDSA awards two \$500 scholarships to SDSA members who are high school seniors or students enrolled in an institution of higher learning. Mary Anne puts together the application packets and the committee members receive blind applications and rate each of them independently. This year's winners were Kirsten VanDenHemel from the Trailbusters Snowmobile Club and Jarret Brown from the Town and Country Snowdrifters. While we were not able to present awards at the schools, we tried to highlight our winners in other ways online.

The deadline for the 2021 scholarship applications is February 25th. The application form and requirements can be found on the SDSA website under the Forms menu. Please be reminded that members already in postsecondary education are still eligible, not just high school seniors. Thank you to all who have purchased Everyone One Wins tickets since \$1,000 of those proceeds will fund future scholarships. We look forward to a pool of great applications!

ACSA report:

The Manufacturers cut ACSA's funding in half which in turn causes changes for ACSA too. ACSA is moving their office into Christine's home rather than operate a separate office. ACSA calendars are here to sell! DC Fly In will be held in April as long as Covid doesn't change the plan. ISC will be in Omaha this year. Poinsett Pounders donated \$250 to the ACSA legal defense fund. Nominations: Trailbusters nominated Gary Ulmer for President. Black Hills Snowmobile Club seconded. Dakota Trailblazers nominated Greg Nordstrom. Sno Trackers seconded. Sno Trackers made a motion to vote by cell phone if you are on zoom. Votes are texted to Sheridan or to Lisa's phones. Town & Country seconded the motion. Motion carried. Voting took place and we continued with the meeting as votes were tallied. Grants: SDSA's main grant activity is with the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association, also known as ISMA. ISMA's Grant process includes a written project description along with a proposed budget including all sources of support. Once the project has been completed a final report is required in order to receive the final advance. This Final Report is to include a detailed recap of the project, including a final financial report as well as pictures of the project. In November 2019, SDSA received a \$3000 Grant for the 2020 Governor's Ride. The application was submitted to offset the expenses of providing an adequate number of rental sleds as we were no longer able to count on the support and/or availability of demo sleds as we had in the past. We also requested that if the sled expense was not as high as expected, that grant funds may be shifted to the brunch and/or social expenses.

The final report was submitted in April 2020. With the availability of GF&P and Forest Service fleet sleds and RSVPs coming in less than previous years, additional sleds were not rented by SDSA. As they were more experienced riders, Jon and Sheridan Laframboise (SDSA Governor's Ride Chair) provided personal sleds for the Governor's daughters. As was written in our grant proposal, in the event the sled expense was not at the projected level, grant funds could be and were shifted to the brunch and/or social expenses. Since these expenses were sufficiently covered with the \$2,500 initial advance of the ISMA Grant fund and SDSA funds, the final \$500 advance was not requested. Thank you to the Black Hills Snowmobile Club for donating back their \$250 Host Compensation which allowed us to stay within the \$2500 initial advance of the Grant.

An acknowledgement of SDSA's efforts with the Governor's Ride and a thank you for saving on grant funds was received by Ed Klim, Executive Director of ISMA.

In November 2020 SDSA was awarded a \$3,000 ISMA Grant for the 2021 Governor's Ride. Notification of the award, along with the \$2500 initial advance was just received from ISMA. This grant application was submitted to offset the meal and beverage costs. If there are any other grant possibilities that you are aware of within your circle of business or other non-profit involvement, please make them known to us. We have been successful in receiving various ISMA Grants through the years, however, other sources would be welcomed.

Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers: Funds are available. It's for hardships and is anonymous. Send the information to Mary Anne if you have someone who falls into the criteria. Governor's Ride: Will be hosted at Spearfish Convention Center \$79.99 rooms. Snocross: January 29 and 30th. We will have a booth there. If you'd like to participate, let Jon know!

Greg Hiles acknowledged how much work Diane does for SDSA. He asked for a round of applause for her. Diane is underpaid for the amount of work that she does for our organization. Kelly added that Mary Anne does a lot to prepare for convention as well and thanked both Diane & Mary Anne for all of their work. Greg Nordstrom added that Mike Boock & Kelly Weaver also worked hard at getting the zoom aspect set up for convention. Freda Nordstrom acknowledged how much she & Greg appreciated Jon's guidance as Greg has been President of SDSA. Jon was a huge help. continued page 38





Selection Process

The SDSA office sends out the Snowmobile of the Year nomination form along with a letter from the President on September 1st of each year. Clubs may nominate one person/family for each category. A nomination form for each person/family must be submitted to the SDSA office by November 1st of each year. As applications are received in the office they are sorted by category and three copies are made. An interview schedule is completed, and contestants are notified of their respective interview times to take place on Saturday of the convention. Personal attendance is highly encouraged. In the event a candidate is unable to interview on site, they may contact the SDSA office and request a remote option (phone, video, etc.).

Three judges will make up the judging panel and the number of panels needed will be determined based upon the number of applications received. Judges are arranged by the Awards Committee working with the Executive Secretary and Host Club. Judges should be familiar with the Awards Program and have good communication skills to interact and interview the applicant(s). Copies of completed applications are provided to the judging panel in advance of the annual convention. The Awards Chairperson or his/her representative will oversee the interview process and see that all interviews are completed within the time allotted. Door monitors may be utilized to ensure the judging panel stays within the allotted interview schedule.

A listing of the interview schedule will be posted outside the room where judging will take place and at other appropriate locations. Following the completion of the interview process, judges will determine the winners of each category and provide their scoring and selection to the Award

Chairperson or his/her representative. Plaques, signed by the SDSA President, will be awarded to the winners at the banquet. Clothing size and name information will be obtained from the winners and will be presented at a later date.
