


Thanks again for an amazing convention and we will see you all at the Snocross races in Deadwood or the Radar Run at Deerfield Lake.

I also serve as a resource for animal care information regarding facilities, nutrition, and animal handling for dairy producers.

At home our family runs Erickson Family Farms a 2,400 acre Grain farm near Oldham, SD. The operation is run by my Inlaws – LeRoy and Lois and my husband, Brian. I enjoy helping around the farming operation as much as time allows, whether it is operating equipment or by helping to make tough business decisions. 
Yesterday was 56 degrees here in Badger, which is a bit different than what I'm used to for Dec. 9th. But the forecast is cooling down,

The following is the speech that I gave at this year's convention. Decided I'd include it in my article this month.

WHERE DOES THE TIME GO?

I started with SDSA January of 2004, so in January I will have been associated with SDSA for 17 years. In a lot of ways, it feels like I just began. SDSA and it's members are very important to me. Without organized snowmobiling, I truly would be worried that our ability to ride anywhere but on our own land would be jeopardized.

Now, I've worked at the SDSA office for 17 years, but my family and I were involved in SDSA beginning in 1994. Our children were quite small when we drove to Pierre to attend SDSA meetings and Governor's Advisory Meetings to get a trail system in our area. 

Many SDSA board members also play a pivotal roll in making sure this convention goes off without a hitch. Game Fish and Parks is very fortunate to work with such a dedicated group of recreationalists like SDSA and Shannon and I are thankful for this relationship. The backbone of SDSA is no doubt the clubs and its members. These are the same folks; I have the privilege of working with through the Grant in Aid program. Over 1,000 miles of trails are groomed, signed and maintained by volunteers who sacrifice blood, sweat and time to bring safe recreational opportunities to the short days of winter. Time is precious in today's world; I suppose like it's always been and it's the one thing we can't get back. Your time spent providing snowmobiling opportunities isn't unnoticed, and Game Fish and Parks is very thankful for your efforts.

Since late October, staff in the Black Hills have been busy clearing trails which were damaged from tornadoes, which touched down on the northern part of the trail system. These are the same folks who will start grooming as conditions allow, clean toilets, stock firewood and so much more. A lot of blood, sweat and time goes into preparing this national recognized trail system, just like it does on the eastern side of the state. Make sure to thank Shannon and his hard working, dedicated crew as you run into them this winter. As of December 1st, they started tackling, signing, placing warming shelters, junction signs and continued trail cleanup. Thank You for your efforts.

If you were able to attend the convention you saw the 2020-2021 snowmobile maps. We talked about the changes that were made from the previous year which included color schemes, outlines of businesses and popular attractions, along with improving the detail of the enlarged areas you see. Hopefully, we can get these distributed across the state before December 15th. Remember to place maps at all your trailside businesses, local chamber of commerce, and gas stations you know snowmobilers frequent. Remember, if no club member ended up attending, let me know so we can get some maps mailed to you.

In closing, we are so close to the season start date and it was such a challenging year, for everyone both personally and professionally no doubt. These challenges will continue throughout the season, but theirs not a better group of people I'd prefer to be going through such difficult times with, than the South Dakota Snowmobile Community. Covid-19 this winter, who knows what it will be next winter, but I'd bet my life savings, we'll always come together and figure it out.

It was a successful day with over \$1,885.05 raised for donations for Clay Misar, 2 large boxes of food for the Kingsbury County Food Pantry and 8 new memberships were obtained for the club and SDSA.

Brian also has taken great pride in chairing the SDSA Booth at the SnoCross event in Deadwood for the past five years. While coordinating SDSA's presence at this event he has helped create greater awareness of attendees at the event by promoting SDSA as an organization. This event is nationally publicized and Brian has provided exposure about the organization through interviews, one on one conversations with attendees, add placements and helping with give snowmobile rides to youth at this event.



Trent Damm named to SDSA's HALL OF FAME

Trent Damm grew up with snowmobiles on the family farm near Badger, SD. In Northeast South Dakota with its' traditionally cold and snowy winter months, Trent's family mainly used snowmobiles to help feed cattle, various other farm chores and as a mode of transportation between the family farms. However, kids will be kids - Trent and his brother, Troy, found the snowmobiles were a BLAST to ride!! This is where Trent's passion for riding snowmobiles began!



Growing up on the family farm, any chance Trent and his brother could ride, they did. Although rides didn't go far back then they would last for many hours and they had many adventures. Unbeknownst at the time, a ride from Badger to the nearest state groomed trail (at the time) near Watertown, would help change the future of the trail systems in Eastern South Dakota. A few years later, a group of friends who were known to ride snowmobile around the Lake Poinsett area regularly, decided to organize and form their own club. Various meetings were attended by this group and eventually the Poinsett Pounder Snowmobile Club was formed in 1995. Trent played an instrumental role in the formation of the Poinsett Pounders and was appointed as one of the original Directors of the Board.

In preparation for the 1st Governor's Winter Games in 1996, the Poinsett Pounders asked the state to groom the ditches around the Lake Poinsett area for their Poker Run. The state's response was "NO". The reason was Lake Poinsett was not part of the state trail program. That answer didn't sit well with Trent as he remembered how well he liked riding the groomed trail near Watertown. Trent again was instrumental in working with the Poinsett Pounder's to begin work on Grants and Aid for trails around Lake Poinsett. Today, a state groomed snowmobile trail exists in much of eastern South Dakota with Lake Poinsett a frequently used area. As Trent and his wife, Stephanie continued to ride snowmobiles with friends and patriciate in various Poinsett Pounder activities, children began to arrive. Trent ensured they were raised around snowmobiles and taught them the importance of organized snowmobiling. Today, Trent's children, their spouses and his grandchildren are all avid snowmobilers and participate in family rides. Any given afternoon during the winter months, Trent is seen giving rides and playing in the snow with his grandchildren. The whole family continues to participate in Poinsett Pounder Club events, SDSA events, and other State Club's events in the area. Trace, his son, currently represents District 7 on the SDSA Board of Directors.

If I listed every Poinsett Pounder and/or SDSA event Trent has contributed to, it would take a long time and it would be a long list so I will just hit a few highlights:

- Through Trent's passion for snowmobiling, his entire family along with many friends are actively involved in snowmobiling, Poinsett Pounder Snowmobile Club and SDSA
- Trent played critical role in the organization of the Poinsett Pounders Snowmobile Club
- Trent has served as Vice-President and President of the Poinsett Pounders in past years
- Trent has helped and continues to help with countless Poinsett Pounder events
- Trent has been presented the SDSA Man of the Year in the past
- Trent has a knack for making chili. He has made his "infamous" chili for the annual Poinsett Pounder's Winter Games Family Day every year since its' inception in 1996
- Trent assisted in the creation and organization of Poinsett Pounder's Ride for the Ribbon events 2020 SDSA Hall of Fame Nomination

- Trent along with his family have helped mark 13 miles of trail for the Poinsett Pounders every year and some years by himself
- Trent assisted with the Easter Seal rides, Governor rides, Ride for the Ribbon, SDSA conventions and the monthly club meetings
- Trent has always promoted the Poinsett Pounders and SDSA wherever and whenever he could and has always been a proud advocate of the Poinsett Pounder Club
