





Brian Erickson named the 2021 ACSA Snowmobiler of the Year

At the 53rd International Snowmobile Congress, Brian Erickson from Arlington, South Dakota, was named the ACSA Snowmobiler of the Year. Erickson has been an active member of the South Dakota Snowmobile Association and ACSA for 22 years.

Erickson's involvement started at the Town & Country Snowdrifters Snowmobile Club, moving into club leadership, then onto the state level and the national level.

As with many snowmobilers, starting as a club member quickly turns into volunteering at different work events, fundraising events, and eventually working your way through the officer positions. This is a natural turn of events for driven and gifted leaders, and Erickson displays all of the leadership traits.

When Erickson was elected President of the SDSA, one of his first actions was to organize a Youth Snowmobile Group, the YETIS. Erickson served as a Youth Safety Instructor at the club level as well as serving as the SDSA Safety Committee Chair. His dedication to safety and assistance shows as he continues to serve as a volunteer fireman in his community.

Leaders lead by example – and Erickson does exactly that! When there is a local land issue

or national forest land issue, this snowmobiler picks up the phone or writes letter. If it's a state issue or national issue, this snowmobiler will fire off a letter to their State officials as well as their DC representatives.

According to SDSA President Greg Nordstrom, "It's all about helping each other out and having a great day of riding for Erickson. He is always there to help out in any and all situations. Erickson is also known to mentor young riders as well as helping to dig out fellow riders in their time of need."

"Erickson understands the challenges and is never shy about getting involved," said Nordstrom. He continued, "Brian is great about getting others to understand the challenges and getting them involved, from the youth to the seasoned riders. He and his wife Tracey have been instrumental in attending events like the Governor's Ride, helping with fundraising, and spreading all of the positives of snowmobiling. SDSA is proud that Brian received this recognition for his efforts."

The link to the online course is: https://www.snowmobile-ed.com/southdakota/ Taking the course is free but if you want to be certified there is currently a fee of \$29.50. SDSA is discussing ideas to help offset that cost for SDSA members. Thanks to the YETIS

for bringing this issue forward!

2. Snowmobiling App. The Board received a demo at our August meeting that we hope is ready to share at convention. It will be a quick and easy one stop access to trail conditions, maps, services, making plans with your



group, and all things snowmobiling. Stay tuned.

3. SDSA Zoom license. We have all learned that we can be effective in this manner and everyone's time is precious. Not only will this be used as needed for SDSA board and committee meetings, Clubs will have access too. Just contact your District Director if you need to schedule a Zoom meeting for your Club.

Your SDSA Board at work! But we only get better as an organization with input and involvement from our members. Let us know what you think about these changes and others you'd like to see!



ACSA announces 2021 Snowmobile Family of the Year



And we are back it and I am looking forward to this year's season as we all come together to promote and support SDSA and to enjoy the sport of snowmobiling we all are so passionate about.

A quick recap of how SDSA ended the last fiscal year to start with. We came from a negative \$1,342.53 beginning balance to a \$2,974.11 positive ending balance and that was after the \$6,500 temporary transfers were returned to our savings account. So a good improvement overall! While memberships were down slightly, advertising and website revenue increased, and we had a great SDSA and YETIS Auction (highest in the last 6 years). Donations were up as well with a side bet from the auction, heads & tails donation, the Black Hills Snowmobile Club donating back their Governor's Ride Host compensation and generous donations from Sno Cross attendees and in Memory of Hazel Seelover and Jean Wilkinson. Overall expenses were less with no DC Flyin again this year and travel, office and website under budget while the rest of our operating expenses were as expected or slightly less.

Ending the year with a positive balance is a great start to the new fiscal year, however, we will continue to operate under a non-balanced budget for the 2021-2022 fiscal year. Both income and expenses are reflected at our best projections based upon history, event locations and this fiscal year's happenings. Depending on how timely dues come in will determine if we will need to utilize temporary transfers from savings again this year. Fundraisers must be successful, we must maintain and increase our membership numbers and we must bring in new advertising accounts as well as maintain the accounts we have had.

Clubs are starting to have their first meetings of the season and we will soon see this year's dues trickling in for both regular memberships and associate memberships. Dues can and should be sent in as soon as you receive them as Membership Benefits start once dues are received in the SDSA office.

Use of our PayPal option to pay SDSA only and SDSA and Club dues continues to increase. If you have a reoccurring membership set up for your dues through PayPal, please check to make sure the amount is at our current dues structure with SDSA only dues at \$25.00 and SDSA Associate Membership dues at \$50.

We will continue to handle club dues paid online the

same as we did last vear. Once SDSA receives notice from PayPal that dues (both SDSA and club dues) have been paid online Mary Anne will forward the notification from PavPal to the respective Club Treasurer (or President if that is the contact person) and myself. This



notification includes the name, address and email address of the member. SDSA's PayPal account is closed out monthly and once I receive confirmation of the deposit to our checking account I, in turn, send the respective club their portion of the online membership dues. Along with the check is a notification of the member whom the club dues are being paid and the amount of club dues paid. Please cash these checks once you receive them!

With all of that said, if you have had Club Officer changes, please notify Mary Anne at the office so these types of communications are received by the appropriate person.

We have some exciting things happening within SDSA this year with a new Sno Plainsman format, a new and forthcoming SDSA snowmobile app along with a revamped Governor's Ride. So let's keep that excitement moving forward by recruiting new memberships and recruiting new advertising accounts from your local area so that more people can share in this exciting time for SDSA!!!

A couple days from now, last year, we got around 10 inches of snow in the black hills. Looks like that's not in the forecast for this year, but we have had some pretty cool nights out there already. With, most of the summer running dry, late August and early September has been a blessing with recent rains across the state. Let's hope that trend continues through our snowmobiling months.

I hope everybody had a wonderful summer and is ready to start thinking snow! Parks have been busier than ever along with amazing fishing at West Bend, I'm guessing your summer was as busy as mine. While we slowly transition from a little less parks stuff to a little more snowmobile responsibilities, I do have some updates about what took place from May until now.

At the August council meeting, 14 grants were approved for the 21-22 Grant-in-Aid program, with those grants totaling just over \$310,000. This is one grant short than we are used to and I like to thank the Redfield club and the Jessen family for all their years of hard work and dedication to providing a safe snowmobile trail for the Redfield community. GFP will miss working with you!

Also approved at the meeting was the fiscal year 2023 snowmobile budget. Not much changed from the previous year as we hope to go to legislation with a \$1.3 million budget request. The council was also updated about where the programs current trails fund balance is and where our fiscal year 2021 revenue and expenses ended up. Total revenue earned last year was just over \$915,000 where our final expenses came in at \$899,652. This meant we added just over \$15,000 to the trails fund balance and that grew the total Snowmobile Trails Program Fund to \$744,579.

Another topic of discussion was organizing a trail signing seminar before clubs begin to sign. This is after the East River trail signing manual was updated to provide more information and more detailed information. While a date and time hasn't been scheduled at the moment I was typing this up, Kim Raap with Trails Work Consulting and myself, will get something organized for the month of September and then plan a Q & A during one of the breakout sessions at this year's state convention. Hard copies of the new signing manual were submitted and should be mailed out and in your hands prior to the seminar being scheduled.

The month of September is always busy with the necessary paperwork to keep the snowmobile season moving forward. This includes GIA and Equipment Agreements, DOT right of way agreements, and other necessary requirements. The



agreements that GFP has with the state should be in the mail by mid-September and if those clubs have the ability to send back a PDQ, instead of mailing it back, you can certainly do so.

Minutes of the SDSA Board of Directors August 7, 2021 Americinn, Chamberlain

President Greg Nordstrom called the meeting to order at 1:04 p.m.

Mary Anne established the roll call as Greg, Duane, Jon, Mike (by zoom), Kelly, Tracey, Pat, Trace, Diane & Mary Anne in attendance. Jason and Taylor were not in attendance. Guests were: Greg Hiles, Sheridan LaFramboise, Marty Grabow, Brian Erickson and Tim Aughenbaugh (by Zoom).

Jon made the motion to approve the agenda as presented. Tracey seconded that. The motion carried.

Duane made a motion to approve the minutes. Kelly seconded. The motion carried.

Diane gave the financial reports. Discussion was held on legacy memberships with regard to the impact to the budget once the 10 years of dues allocation has maxed out and how the remaining dues allocation is transferred to the promotion allocation upon the death of a legacy member.

SDSA App Update was given by Tim Aughenbaugh. Sledder App was explained in detail. Discussion of possible revenue sharing in advertising and annual membership fee to advertisers. App can connect to other apps such as Facebook, Instagram, tiktok, snapchat etc. *Start with the sledder app and then connect the others. It will allow chat groups of up to 100(?) to get engagement and involvement. Board wants to move forward with the app with a select group and work through some of the bugs and try to have it ready to unveil by convention with revenue sharing in place. *Trace, Mike, Jason and Mary Anne are on the committee (same committee as website). Have committee get on the app and try it out and slowly add the board to the group

as well to try out the app. The monetary end needs to be figured out prior to convention!

PRESIDENT REPORT – Greg feels our organization and board are moving in the right direction. We are attempting to bring the next generation into snowmobiling! The app could be the key!

Mary Anne gave the Sno Plainsman/Office Report: SP committee wants to switch to a magazine

format. There will be 4 extra color pages since we are doing a magazine format. She has been working on reformatting the new publication. Duane & Mary Anne have worked on ads and we have over \$9000 in firm commitments for the next season already. Mike will do the flip page for us and can do linked ads in the flip version. We featured ads on Facebook last season and will continue this year. Mary Anne thanked Diane for helping get the word out on RTP funds that needed to be sent. She also visited with the board regarding Jason's wife's illness to explain why he isn't here today and mentioned the fundraiser that is being planned by his club for them. She also visited about the Ski-doo grant program that is available for clubs.

Gov Relations: Greg reemphasized that we need to make sure RTP is emphasized to our leaders when legislation is pending. (As it is now). RTP for us is not increasing but the other areas are. We need to get ahold of our people in DC and get this fixed!!

Grants – Tracey reported that the ISMA grant is due October 1 if we want to apply for Governor's Ride. The grant is for \$3000. Once again, we can teach safety at the event to qualify in a few categories.

Fundraiser: Mike sent out a breakdown for the Everyone Wins raffle tickets. If changes are needed, now is the time. Mike added Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers for \$1000 just because he felt the fund was getting low. Tracey made a motion to set as follows: \$10,000 for first place \$2,000 for second; \$500 for seller of most tickets and \$1000 scholarship = \$13,500, payout. \$11,500 would be SDSA's profit. Second by Duane. Kelly would like to go on record that she feels the convention host should be left on. The fundraiser should have the name changed though. Motion passed with 1 against. There needs to be a fundraiser set up for Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers! Maybe one or two clubs will step up! The funds are getting quite low.

Convention: Celebrate Freedom to Ride. Trailbusters would like John Green's contact info. Deadline for the ad for the Sno Plainsman is September 1st. Convention is November 5 & 6 in Mitchell at The Highland Conference Center. Hotels: Comfort Inn or Hampton Inn.

Kelly handed out a report on past conventions.

Duane spoke about membership. How can we help clubs promote membership?

SOPS: Jon read the recommended changes to Attachment III of the SOPS regarding Club Awards (as noted in red)

C. Club Awards

Each year at the annual convention, SDSA recognizes its Charter Clubs with the largest membership and the Charter Club with the largest percentage increase in members. The members counted for the purpose of these awards include both paid club memberships and Associate memberships that are sold by the Charter Club. The guidelines for these awards are as follows.

Largest Membership

The Charter Club with the most members as of the end of the previous fiscal year (June 30 prior to convention) is awarded a trophy at the annual convention. The trophy will be engraved with the Club name and year of the award.

2. Largest Percentage Increase

The Charter Club whose membership has increased by the highest percentage over the previous year is awarded a trophy at the annual convention. The trophy will be engraved with the Club name and year of the award. The percentage increase is calculated as follows:

Membership (award year) - Membership (previous year)

X 100 = % Increase

Membership (previous year)

Jon made the motion to make this change. Tracey seconded. Motion carried.

Jon read the changes proposed for Section III. ADMINISTRA-TIVE FUNCTIONS, D. Board of Director Meetings, 1. Meeting Dates. Much discussion ensued. Face to face vs. zoom was discussed. Hybrid vs. zoom was discussed. There were many opinions. Kelly will rewrite the proposed changes and we will come back to that.

Jon read the changes proposed for Section III, ADMINISTRA-TIVE FUNCTIONS, D. Board of Director Meetings, 2. Meeting Agenda Schedule. The following changes are recommended which are highlighted in RED lettering.

D. Board of Director Meetings

2. Meeting Agenda Schedule

The agenda for the Board of Director's meetings is set by the President with input from Staff and Board members. The agenda, all financial reports, and any other pertinent information is sent to Board members at least one week in advance of the meeting. A notice of all upcoming board meetings shall be posted on the Events tab of the SDSA webpage and emailed to the Board of Directors a minimum of one week in advance and shall include the following items: Meeting Date, time, location, whether face to face or virtual, how to register for a virtual meeting and the meeting agenda. In addition to the regular committee reports, there are business items that routinely are handled the same time every year. A listing of these items is shown below for each regularly scheduled meeting and should be used as a starting point for the agenda for that meeting. Jon made a motion to accept the changes. Pat seconded. Motion carried.

Zoom License: The SDSA subcommittee recommends the \$149.90 yearly Zoom license. Put it in as a meeting expense item. Jon made the motion to do the \$149.90 license. Duane seconded. Motion carried. Password should be changed annually for it and should be accessible by the board. Discussion was held on letting clubs use as a benefit of SDSA unless we find we need a larger license to accommodate everyone. Going back to the SOP regarding the Board of Director Meetings, 1 Meeting Dates, Kelly read the re-written recommended SOP changes (in red lettering).

A. Board of Director Meetings

1. Meeting Dates

Unless otherwise set by the Board of Directors or called by the President, the Board of Directors will meet six times per year, in conjunction with snowmobile related events when possible. Meetings dates are established at the Post-Convention Meeting and are usually held in the following months: February (with Governor's Ride), May (with Governor's Snowmobile Advisory Council meeting), August (with Governor's Snowmobile Advisory Council meeting) and either November or December for the SDSA Convention with Pre-Convention, Annual and Post-Convention meetings.

Face to face board meetings would be held for the February meeting with the Governor's Ride and the SDSA Convention (includes Pre-Convention, Convention and Post-Convention meetings). Hybrid meetings would be conducted in May and August, preferably the same day as the Governor's Advisory meeting, if a suitable location for an effective hybrid meeting is available, thus allowing board members the option to attend either in person or virtually. If a suitable room is not available, a 'virtual only' meeting would be held.

Tracey made the motion to accept #1 on BOD SOP changes. Jon seconded. Motion carried.

Ryan did inform us that as Trails Specialist, it is his responsibility to meet with the SDSA Boar and within that responsibility he would be able to secure a room at the Capital Building if it is ever necessary again to meet on a different date and/or time than the Advisory Council meets. With that known, there should be a suitable location for an effective hybrid meeting.

Sno Plainsman – relate your articles to your clubs and to your district. Mike will come up with some themes for the articles. One thing we could do is highlight associate members, advertisers, know your directors, create a list of questions, etc.

Greg suggested that we leave the districts untouched. Perhaps directors can help each other out if there is a club that is hard for them to get to.

Duane talked about a supper meeting September 23rd at Hill-side Resort on the south side of Lake Madison 7 p.m. – to increase Interlakes membership.

Safety – Online course is available. We would like to see SDSA members at least receive a discount . We hope that SDSA will receive a report when people test thru the site. Ryan will check if we can post the link on our website or not.

Charity report: SD ranked well in ISC reports for charities. Trails Specialist: Black Hills trails reroute on Kaschmitter property by Rec Spring. Trail 6 will be moved to get off private property. The private property being bought has been increasing. Shannon has been scouting reroutes. Fat tire bikes haven't been meeting lately. The trail around Big Hill will probably still be their only trail.

East River Update: Ryan has been delivering Rotary hammer drills to clubs. Not all clubs will get the attachment, but they will have to share.

V & V Insurance is getting insurance in place for the clubs.

Signing manuals will be sent out to the clubs. Plans are underway to hold seminars on the manuals before the season starts - after Labor Day / Mid-October. Whether these will be face to face or a hybrid type setting is still in the works, but for sure Ryan would like to have a session at the convention and will be talking to the Trailbusters to make those arrangements.

Redfield club will not be included in the trail program.

FY 2021 – total revenue was 915,112. This is the highest revenue in 5-6 years. Total expenses 862,760.00! We added more than

\$52,352. \$\$\$ to the trails fund! 9,735 registered sleds. This is the lowest # in a long time. People are buying sleds but they aren't licensing them! Ryan will check into this with the department of revenue. 52 or 72 resident temporary permits this year.

Presenting a 1.3 million budget authority. RTP motorized \$309,000. \$209,000 for a groomer and \$100,000 for snowmobile related projects such as bridges on Mickelson trail. This is the full 30% for motorized RTP funds.

Scholarship: No report other than the scholarship entries will be due in February.

Governor's Ride: Spearfish Holiday Inn will be our host hotel for February 11 and 12. Legislative social hour on Friday evening. Saturday night BOD meeting. Hotel rooms \$89.99 standard and Suites 119.99. Food options will be discussed at a later date. We'll shuttle legislators out to the ride on Saturday morning. Advisory Council may want to meet on Friday afternoon. BOD will meet at 5 p.m on Saturday. Trailshead is good with the new dates. Mike will talk with Trailshead about options for reserving more sleds and letting them go without penalty if we have to let them go (what would the time period be). Snowmobiles are reserved! Mary Anne will let legislators know of our change of date now and get the registration info out on the website as soon as we can. SDSA will need to have an informational meeting after advisory council possibly.

Snocross - no report

YETIS- no report

Tax Preparation – Jon made a motion that Wilkinson & Schumacher of De Smet do the tax preparation again. Kelly seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Membership discount - Most are all on board yet.

ISC – Iowa sponsorship – Kelly made a motion to support Iowa and do an afternoon break for \$500. Jon seconded. Motion carried.

Trailshead cam is in and as soon as it is operational, we will send them \$500. Rec Springs wants a camera on the same basis and Duane has got a sponsor ready to go.

Funeral for Associate Member/Advertiser/etc: Tracey made a motion to donate \$50 to Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers in memory of Jim LeTendre, former owner of Power Brokers. Kelly seconded. Motion carried.

Brian asked for discussion regarding ACSA calendars and whether they should still print or not.

ISHOF donation tabled until next meeting.

Brian Erickson was named Snowmobiler of the Year for ACSA and he was also elected to the ACSA Board. Congratulations Brian!

Jon made a motion to adjourn at 5:20 p.m Tracey seconded. Carried.

These minutes have not been approved by a vote of the board.

ACSA announces 2021 Young Snowmobiler of the Year

At the 53rd International Snowmobile Congress, AJ Krueger from Wausau, Wisconsin was named the ACSA Young Snowmobiler of the Year. Kreuger got involved in her snowmobile club 16 years ago, and more recently become involved with Youth Snowmobiling, Kids and Adults Out Snowmobiling (KAOS). She has volunteered working the Grass Drags, brushing and marking trails, fundraising and participated in the Badger State Games Torch Run.

Krueger said she "realized it's easier to get the entire family involved (Mom, Dad and Kids) rather than just trying to get one person involved. This also promotes family riding and togetherness!" Getting the next generation involved is an important goal, as well as getting the attention of non-snowmobilers as well as snowmobiling families.

In just 2 years, she has spoken to over 600 new youth. Krueger was successful in getting all kids over the age of 12, who had taken their snowmobile safety class and is active in the club, the opportunity to have their voices heard and assist in club activities – by giving them the ability to vote!

Krueger's original involvement was with the Wisconsin Kids Snowmobile Racing Association and the Wisconsin Kitty Cat Racers. So, it came as no surprise that AJ was not able to receive her award due to a previous engagement, racing her truck in Iowa the evening of the awards. She is also an active truck racer, traveling around Wis-



consin and surrounding states competing on the race


"Having young and enthusiastic involvement like AJ is the future of snowmobiling" stated AWSC President Dave Newman. "With youth involvement and encouragement from young snowmobilers like AJ, our future is bright! Passionate snowmobilers, especially young snowmobilers, are the future leaders of our sport. We are so proud of AJ and the entire KAOS group!"

Team Jim Langley and Clark Dahlin, Anoka/Cambridge, Minnesota - Explorers and Adventurers inductees to the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame Hetteen pulling him aside telling

Jim Langley and Clark Dahlin achieved a monumental journey like no other by completing a transcontinental snowmobile expedition starting in Vancouver, British Columbia and ending in Portland, Maine, On November 28, 1966, they left the shores of the Pacific Ocean embarking on an adventure many said couldn't be done. Two men on two 1967 Polaris Colts conquered a continent in 24 days and 4,018 miles where they literally drove their sleds in the icy shores of the Atlantic Ocean. Because interconnecting snowmobile trails were all but non-existent at the time, the route was destined to require extensive travel on roadways. Therefore, the machines were properly equipped for road travel, which meant extra headlights, windshield wipers, turn signals, seat belts and license plates were necessary. Also, wheel kits were added to the skis since much of the trip would lead them to no snow conditions. Weather also provided challenges, which were successfully overcome.

At first, during planning stages of this expedition Allen Hetteen was reluctant. Polaris donated the sleds but did not fully sponsor for fear of bad publicity pending failure. However, once the two men reached Roseau, Minnesota after crossing the plains of Manitoba in 40 below winds chills. Jim Langlev recalls Allen

him. "Jim. we're on the right track"! The orders were coming in. Dealers were doubling their orders for new sleds. The positive publicity and exciting news coverage of these two men and their machines were paying off.



This journey also deemed Jim & Clark the first to ever cross Michigan's Mackinac Bridge on snowmobiles. Team Langley and Dahlin averaged 168 miles per day. One day of the trip they logged 336 miles.

Their coast-to-coast expedition 55 years ago was truly a great feat for the early days of snowmobile development and for one manufacturer in particular. It is this amazing piece of snowmobile history that lands Jim Langley and Clark Dahlin squarely in the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame, Class of 2021.

Henry & Peggy Hartman, Hanover, Pennsylvania - Publishers and Journalists

Henry and Peggy Hartman were the Editors and Publishers of the "Keystone Snowmobiler" for 30 years (1989-2019), a newspaper which served as the official publication of the Pennsylvania State Snowmobile Association (PSSA). The Keystone Snowmobiler was the only known publication of its kind to be printed and mailed all 12 months of the year. The Hartmans thrived on enthusiastically promoting snowmobiling as a safe, fun and family oriented sport for all to enjoy! Henry, also well known for his strong mechanical abilities, took ownership of a long existing Polaris dealership in Hanover from 1985 to 1997. These were the "Indy" years. Henry and Peggy sold and serviced machines in southern Pennsylvania and northern Maryland.

Henry and Peggy both participated in organized snowmobiling, on local, state and national levels. Their hometown club, Pigeon Hills Snowmobile Club is where Henry served several terms as President and Peggy as Secretary. The Pigeon Hills Club, along with the Hartmans, had their annual fundraiser, the Mason Dixon Snowmobile Grass Drags which went on for 20 years. Henry was very involved with the technical side of scoring the race sleds and Peggy helped run the food stand. This is just one example of how active Henry and Peggy were with the snowmobile clubs near their hometown.

On a state level, The Hartmans have been very active with PSSA in various roles beyond the newspaper. Henry served as Region 5 Director in the mid 1980's. Since 1996, Henry and Peggy have implemented the Used Sled Coral at the PSSA Fall Show. This proved to be a lucrative fundraiser which gave participants excellent opportunities to buy or sell their used sleds.

On a national level, the Hartmans covered news through the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA). They attended and covered stories of more than 20 International Snow-



mobile Congresses. They were also active members of the International Snowmobile Media Council.

Henry also has a long history of working with the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources on educating the youth on snowmobile safety. To this day, he is still a very active Snowmobile Safety Instructor spanning over 45 years. Henry has participated in teaching nearly 2000 students to ride safely and responsibly. Henry and Peggy's commitment to snowmobiling went way beyond the publishing business. Their very long and unwavering devotion to the sport is the reason they are being inducted into the International Snowmo-

bile Hall of Fame, Class of 2021.


Dave and Joann Smith, Mosinee, Wisconsin - Volunteers and Club Organizers

The Smiths bought their first snowmobiles as soon as they moved to Wisconsin Rapids in 1977. Excited to experience Wisconsin winters, they searched for places to ride and meet people to ride with. A year had gone by before they learned of a local snowmobile club, the Kellner Knights. The club was there vet seemingly hard to find even for folks like the Smiths, who were looking. Being that the club seemed hidden in plain sight, Dave and Joann made it their pet project to put together a grassroots public relations campaign that made the Kellner Knights front and center to any snowmobile enthusiast looking for a club to join. It worked! In only two years the club's membership grew from 35 to 150. Not long after, Dave was elected club president and AWSC Wood County Director. Joann became the club's treasurer. Word got out and they were invited to do a presentation on their membership program at the International Snowmobile Congress.

Dave and Joann were recognized and respected in organized snowmobiling on a state, national and international level. Joann became the first woman vice president of the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC). She served as V.P. for two years continuing to champion the importance of club membership. Her efforts did not go unnoticed. She joined Bombardier Corporation when they moved their offices to Wausau and became a Project Leader in public relations. She also served as the representative for Ski-Doo on the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (ISMA) Public Relations Committee. It was a good fit, one that lasted 20 years and although

supposedly retired, Joann and Dave continue to work for BRP (Ski-Doo) as independent contractors managing photo and media shoots.

No matter how involved the Smiths were on a national level they remained grounded with the AWSC and their local snowmobile clubs. Dave was voted in as



AWSC executive director for 2 years and then vice president for 4 years. He was the AWSC Director for Marathon County and Vice President of the Marathon County Snowmobile Council for several years. He served the Wausau Trailmates Snowmobile Club as vice president, being their race track chairman for their annual grass drags for over 20 years and was a groomer operator. Joann manages the Trailmates website and monthly newsletters.

Dave and Joann have literally been and still are involved in every level of snowmobile organizations. Their strong yet unassuming leadership qualities and devotion to snowmobiling are key reasons for the Smith's long overdue induction into the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame, Class of 2021.

Charlie and Marilyn Vallier, Naubinway, Michigan - Explorers and Adventurers

Charlie's obsession with snowmobiling began when his dad purchased a Hus-Ski 444 snow machine for him and his seven siblings to ride. After high school Charlie went into the Army where he met Marilyn, who had never been around snowmobiles before. In 1971, Charlie talked his dad into starting a Viking dealership. His passion for snowmobiling was clearly contagious and Marilyn soon became acclimated to the sport as well. When Viking went out of business, they switched to a Scorpion dealership until Scorpion's demise in the early 80's. With a strong passion for snowmobiles, Charlie was always finding and working on old sleds and became an active member of the Antique Snowmobile Club of America where he serves as a Director. Charlie had gained a personal collection of over 200 sleds. This is where his dream of having his own museum began. Charlie and Marilyn first opened the Top of the Lake Snowmobile Museum on July 4, 2007 from a rented building they remodeled that once was a laundromat. It wasn't long before they filled that space and needed to relocate. They broke ground on a much larger new building at what is now their current location, highly visible on Highway 2 in Naubinway. It opened in October, 2013. They dedicate most of their time to the museum so it could be open to the public seven days a week. They quickly gained notoriety and the Top of the Lake Museum was recognized by

The club has grown from about a dozen families in 1968 to over 414 family, individual and business booster memberships in 2020. Red Arrow grooms 65 miles of trails and is one of nine other clubs that make up the Oconto County Snowmobile and ATV Alliance that maintain a total 475 miles of snowmobile trails. Red Arrow is very active in local, county-wide and state organizations such as the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs and the Wisconsin ATV Association. Their members work hard to make both their winter and summer trail system "among the best" in the State of Wisconsin. Red Arrow promotes the "Take a Friend Snowmobiling" program and encourages members to get friends and family involved in the sport. Club members have always held a strong traditional work ethic, yet have embraced modern technology utilizing all the popular social media outlets to promote the club and motorized recreation in general. As a result, they have been fortunate to maintain a healthy supply of active club members who make their presence known in the local community and beyond. It is for these reasons and 50+ years of dedication to snowmobiling and motorized recreation in general that warrants The Red Arrow Club the 2021 International Snowmobile Club of the Year.

SnowGoer Magazine as being the Best Snowmobile Museum in North America. Currently the museum is home to 185 snowmobiles and countless snowmobile related items.

Charlie and Marilyn attend numerous vintage/antique snowmobile shows and swap meets throughout



the Midwest. In order to raise funding for the museum, they sell many snowmobile related items. The most popular of which is Charlie's signature wooden snowmobile rockers that engrain the idea of snowmobiling to the youngest of toddlers. Charlie and Marilyn have several organized events annually. One example, always keeping the youth in mind and exposed to snowmobiling, they have "The Ride Your Sled to School Day". About 30 kids will ride their snowmobiles to school and when school lets out, Charlie leads them on a trail ride to the museum

They have dedicated their lives not only to the preservation of snowmobile history but keeping the love for snowmobiles alive & fun. For this, Charlie & Marily Vallier are awarded induction in the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame, Class of 2021.

International Snowmobile Dealer of the Year - sponsored by Snow Goer & Supported by the Midwest Chapter & Western Chapter of Snowmobile Associations: Ken's Sports, Kaukauna, Wisconsin

Starting out in 1968 selling Arctic Cat snowmobiles, Ken and Mary Vander Loop have grown their business to what is considered the largest power sports dealership in Wisconsin. Small family owned, community minded business practices have always been the back bone of their success. Their involvement with organized snowmobiling dates back to the earliest years of this sport and as snowmobiling developed, Ken's Sports was always there doing all it could to facilitate its growth. Ken's is a huge supporter of local snowmobile clubs and the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs. In the early years, Ken volunteered countless hours doing trail work and helped groom the trails as well. For 53 years, snowmobile clubs and county alliances have been coming to Ken's Sports for donations to support their various fund raising events. A decades old AWSC Commercial sponsor, Ken's Sports was there at the Associations' Workshops and Conventions. For 13 years Ken's Sports has been a major sponsor of the annual Military Appreciation Ride in Eagle River, Wisconsin by donating snowmobile gear and helmets to help introduce Military Veterans and their families to the sport of snowmobiling. 

2021 Edgar Hetteen Memorial Award of Merit - sponsored by the Elmer Cone Family & the Iron Dog Brigade: Mickey Rupp, Mansfield, Ohio

Mickey Rupp started Rupp Manufacturing in 1959 with 8 employees in Mansfield, Ohio, building go-karts and mini-bikes. By 1964 Rupp Mfg. Built about 50 prototype snowmobiles which turned into 500 "first year" sleds for the 1965 model year. Mickey felt confident he could improve on snowmobile designs that other manufacturers were currently using, with an emphasis on performance. This was to be done by making them more light weight employing aluminum tunnels and bulkheads. Also, he was one of first sled manufacturers that designed an aerodynamic down swept hood. This would give the machines a sportier look and allow the drivers to see better in front of them rather than the common boxy designs of the time. By 1969, Rupp Manufacturing had grown to over 400 employees producing models of the Rupp Sno-Sport snowmobiles as well as their go-karts and mini-bikes. In 1970, Mickey Rupp had taken Rupp Mfg. to 30 million dollars in sales, producing



35,000 snowmobiles. Mickey Rupp rode and tested all his own



products along with his employees. He was always innovating and engineering new prototypes. RUPP is still a recognized name in the snowmobile industry today. Mickey Rupp's performance driven sled designs pushed the other larger snowmobile manufacturers to build a more sporty recreational type snowmobile. This warrants Mickey Rupp the recipient of the 2021 Edgar Hetteen Memorial Award of Merit.
