





From SDSA's President-Elect

Are you looking for an exciting adventure and bonding experience to share with your fellow club members?

Host an SDSA Convention! It really isn't all that complicated to host a convention and even small clubs can do it. The Trailbusters had just 15 members last year and they have hosted 3 conventions in recent history. With this past

convention, they proved again that a small team can get the job done. So what are you waiting for?

It starts with a person or two or three to take the lead, keep track of the decisions made and the timeline for tasks to be completed. This group is generally the main contact with the host property/caterer. From there, tasks can be shared among other members to work on parts of the convention – entertainment, registrations, vendors/sponsors, auction. EVERYONE helps collect the auction items. Take advantage of your members' unique skills and connections. Your club has hosted other events that require similar skillspoker runs, fundraising rides, club trips. This is just on a little bigger scale.

You do not have to live in the town where the convention is hosted. You'll probably only visit the host property a few times during the planning process. This year's convention was not held in a 'convention hotel', and it worked great. We've also had conventions hosted at casino sites. You need space that can hold the large group functions and a few other smaller meeting rooms. Ideally there would be

lodging connected or nearby with 80 to 100 sleeping rooms.

If you are worried about it being a financial burden to your club, I would submit it is just the opposite. Done right, you can cover your costs and even add some to your Club Treasury in the end. If the Black Hills Snowmobile Club can host a convention successfully in the midst of a pandemic, you can have confidence in your club's financial status while hosting a convention.

Oh, did I mention you do not have to do it alone? There are a handful of folks across the state who have organized a convention or two or three. To a person, I know they would gladly provide guidance, offer tips, and answer any questions you have. SDSA has guidelines outlining the basic requirements, but having an expert in your corner can't be topped.

The Convention is significant to SDSA not only for its fundraising function but also for building the bonds between clubs and members across the state working toward a common cause and having a darn good time doing it! The same can be said of the benefits to the host club.

Convention bids are now being accepted until February 1st and will be reviewed at the Governor's Ride board meeting on February. 11. The form can be found at the SDSA website under the Forms menu. So step out in faith, take on the

challenge, and reap the rewards of accomplishing something significant with and for your club and SDSA. Need some help putting it all together? I hope I will be one of your first calls. Let the ADVENTURE begin!

International Snowmobile Safety Week: January 15-23, 2022

Haslett, MI, November 17, 2021: The snowmobile community will sponsor the 28th annual International Snowmobile Safety Week. This is a special event for the snowmobile community, including State and Provincial Snowmobile Associations, Visitors and Convention Bureaus, Chambers of Commerce, Snowmobile Clubs and local and state and provincial agencies joining together to recognize the importance of safe, responsible snowmobiling. Many groups highlight safety week by holding various snowmobile safety training programs. All of the efforts highlight the key position statements highlighted by the safety week efforts. Those key points include:

- Snowmobiling and alcohol don't mix Don't drink and ride.
- Smart Riders are Safe Riders Take a snowmobile safety training course.
- When night riding slow down Expect the unexpected.
- Know before you go Always check local ice conditions
- Cross with Care
- Know the risks and be prepared Make every trip a round trip
- One is the loneliest number Never ride alone.
- Ride safe, stay on the trail Respect private property.

Avalanche Awareness:

When snowmobiling in Avalanche terrain, always check the existing conditions. You can do so by visiting one of the two websites:

☐ United States: www.avalanche.org

☐ Canada: www.avalanche.ca

The five guidelines for mountain terrain riding:

- Get the Gear: Ensure everyone has an avalanche transceiver, shovel, and probe on their person and knows how to use them
- Get the Training: Take an avalanche course
- Get the Forecast: Make a riding plan based on the current avalanche and weather forecast
- Get the Picture: If you see recent avalanche activity unstable snow exists. Riding on or underneath steep slopes can be dangerous
- Get out of Harm's Way: One at a time on all avalanche slopes. Don't go to help your stuck friend. Don't group up in runout zones.

This year we are continuing our effort that all snowmobilers must respect private landowners and public land and the land managers. We highlight the need to protect land use privileges and to stay on the trail and if you don't know – don't go. Remember to Take the Pledge at https://snowmobilerspledge.com

Snowmobile Clubs and Associations / Federations are encouraged to invite local representatives from the business community to go snowmobiling and show them our known, safe riding standards. There is information available from the ISMA Office to help support your efforts. That information includes the Safe Rider video chapter series, with 13 videos, located on the www.snowmobile.org and www.gosnowmobiling.org websites. All of the videos are free and can be downloaded and used at local events. There is a Safety Week Manual available to download, from www.snowmobile.org, with ideas on how to set up a Safety Week event and get the International Snowmobile Safety Week recognized in your community.





President Greg Nordstrom called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

Mary Anne established the roll call as: Greg Nordstrom, Duane Duerr, Jon LaFramboise, Mike Boock, Kelly Weaver, Tracey Erickson, Pat Hanten-Duerr, Jason Shepherd, Trace Damm, Taylor Weelborg, Diane Hiles & Mary Anne Grabow.

Tracey made the motion to approve the agenda with the addition of SOP change as item #4 in new business. Mike seconded. Motion carried.

Guests included David Ruediger, Kirsten VanDenHemel, Dug Weelborg, Brian Erickson, Dave & Jean Kennedy, Jim Weaver, Kim Raap and Sheridan LaFramboise.

Duane made a motion to approve the August minutes as presented. Jon seconded. Motion carried.

Diane went over the financial reports. Kelly made the motion to file the reports for review. Mike seconded. Motion carried.

President Report: Greg emphasized what a good group we have on the board to lead SDSA.

Sno Plainsman – We were able to keep the majority of our advertisers. For the one we lost I signed up a new one to replace it and they took more issues. Duane added Power Brokers and Interlakes this season and Mary Anne added Fieber Vans Implement and Polaris Ride Command.

Office – Things have been hectic with convention, hotel room issues, convention orders, nominations, membership work and layout.

Government Relations - no report

Convention: Kelly reported that the Trailbusters, Driftbusters and the Mitchell club have a hospitality room together. Kelly made a motion to extend the 2023 convention deadline to February 1. Jon seconded. Motion carried.

Membership/website: Our #'s need to increase. Dug Weelborg spoke about being a recreational club as opposed to just a snowmobile one. There are definitely pros and cons to it. A committee will be set up to look into this.

Safety – There is a discount code for the first 50 people to use the online course. Poinsett will reimburse their members who take the course on line. Cost of the course is \$29.50

Charity – 10 clubs reported. More of the clubs really need

to get reports in! The numbers are important.

Trails Report: Advisory will meet at 5:30 on Friday of Governor's Ride. Let the legislators know that they can see the council in action. Full time snowmobile person will be hired and based out of Shannon's office.

Governor's Ride – Feb 11 & 12. Tracey announced we got the \$3000 grant from ISMA. We could possibly do a van from the Holiday Inn to Hardy Camp Saturday morning. SDSA will meet on Saturday at 5 p.m. Rooms are \$89 or 119 for a Suite. The Group code is GOV. Suggested fun program for legislators similar to last year's safety program. Mike has locked in 7 singles and 7 doubles at Trailshead for the event. Advisory will pay for up to 15 sleds for the event. Black Hills SC is doing the breakfast again for us. Snocross January 28 & 29.

YETIS – They are creating a logo for the safety certificate. 2021 Convention – 140 are preregistered for the event.

Back the Ride – Perhaps it should be listed in the October issue each year and also on the website. Much discussion was held. The following is the original proposal.

YETIS – social media guidelines:

SOPS already cover all the guidelines for website and social media. But we should add NO LIVESTREAMING unless by board approval.

Sno Plainsman survey – Kelly asked Mary Anne to send out to the membership. Tracey suggested that we could host an online auction. It was mentioned that items don't normally come in until the day of the auction.

Trailshead webcam is up and running. Thank you Mike for all your work on this project! Track to Trail and Power Brokers Inc sponsored that. Rec Springs – we need an update on their camera. Nordstroms has put up the \$ to sponsor that one.

We hope to have an app update by Governor's Ride. Mike made a motion to adjourn at 3:25 p.m. Duane seconded.

Presidents Report: Greg thanked the board for their efforts this year.

Shoshone National Forest: Kim Raap asked everyone to send in comments for the travel plan. He handed out suggested wording to be submitted by November 17.

Sno Plainsman: During the course of the year Greg appointed Mike, Jason Trace & I to a new Sno Plainsman committee. We weighed all the options and made the decision to switch to a magazine format. It was a lot of work but all the feedback has been nothing but positive. I've picked up a few new advertisers and maintained last season's advertisers as well. Thing are looking up for the Sno Plainsman. Thank you to the advertisers, associates and all the members. And a big thank you to the board. It's been an enjoyable year!

YETIS: The YETIS worked on the online safety course. Working on designing a logo for the safety certificate. If you have kids ages 12 - 20, we're looking for new members.

Government Relations – Kim covered this in his report. Investment – Edward Jones account is doing extremely well. We have over \$125,000 in our investment fund. It did really well this year. This money is from 2004 & 2016 ISC funds. Money is set aside in the event we have to fight for our right to ride and need to hire lawyers.

Safety: Thanks to the YETIS for setting up the safety course on line. It costs \$29.50. The Governor's Advisory Council approved 50 people that they will cover the cost for.

Membership & Website: Our numbers are down a bit. June 30 2020 616 members as opposed to 582 this year. Total 713 members this year as opposed to 761 the previous year. Discussion was held at President's meeting as to why the numbers are down. The price of membership was not listed as a reason that numbers went down. It's more the amount of activities everyone has going on, etc. Duane Duerr presented a Legacy membership to Kim Raap on behalf of the Sioux Falls Sno Trackers. Watertown Snowmobile club presented a legacy membership in honor of Sara Shepherd. Fundraiser: We're in the middle of the big payout. We currently have about 100 tickets that we don't have turned in to see if they are sold. Mike has 20 some to sell for sure. Sell tickets to family & friends before you get to convention! Charity: South Dakota reported \$4,154 national charity donations; \$31,612 local charity donations with a total of \$35,766. 7,841 hours donated reported by 10 clubs out of


Hello Snowmobilers!


Hello again fellow snowmobilers!!!

Did you know these Snow Facts?????

There are four major manufacturers that build snowmobiles. They are Arctic Cat - head-quartered in Thief River Falls, MN; BPR - headquartered in Valcourt, Quebec: Polaris Industries -headquartered in Medina, MN and Yamaha Motor Corporation - headquartered in Ontario, Canada.

In 2020 there were 123,862 snowmobiles sold worldwide; 51,036 were sold in the US and 43,535 were sold in Canada. There are over 1.1 million registered snowmobiles in the US and 543,000 registered snowmobiles in Canada, further broken down by state/province in this table.

Snowmobiling is great exercise bringing people outdoors interacting with nature and each other. It is an invigorating sport great for stress relief and good mental health. Snowmobiling is a great family lifestyle. It is an activity keeping parents and kids together. Historically individuals who snowmobile at a young age continue to snowmobile with their parents throughout their lives sharing great experiences as a family. In many winter regions snowmobiling is simply the main form of winter outdoor recreation and in some cases the main method of transportation available.

The use of snowmobiles in National Parks is regulated by federal Law Enforcement. Snowmobiling occurs on roads groomed and marked for snowmobiling the same roadways used by recreational vehicles, cars, trucks and buses. Snowmobiles are NOT used as off-road vehicles in National Parks such as Yellowstone, Rocky Mountain and Grand Teton.

On U.S. National Forest land most of the trails used by snowmobiles are on groomed roads used by summer recreationalists. There are also secondary and seasonal roads within the forests used by snowmobilers. These roads are groomed and marked by volunteers who work closely with the local U.S. Forest Service staff in maintaining in managing those areas.
