



The last time the snow conditions were this bad was 1998 when Jim Weaver was SDSA President.)



When you see a No Trespassing sign, do not go there; respect the landowner's right to keep anyone he wishes off his land.

Something to note, the Governor's South Dakota Snowmobile Advisory Council, consists of Dave Kennedy, Bruce Hintz, Todd Sprang, Al Nagel, Todd Wilkinson, Gary Ulmer, and Scott Erstad. They are appointed to the Council by the Governor and work diligently with the Game, Fish, and Parks to oversee the Grant in Aid Program, the SD Snowmobile Trail system, and any other snowmobile issues that arise.

The SD Snowmobile Advisory Council meets three to four times a year, typically prior to the SDSA Board of Directors meetings. I would encourage all snowmobilers to sit in on their meetings or participate via Zoom when links are available. The meeting times, locations and Zoom meeting links are posted under the events tab on the SDSA webpage, https://snowmobilesd.com/. This is one way you can stay connected and aware of what is happening with snowmobiling the trail systems in South Dakota.

Speaking of government, I wanted to share an article taken from the ACSA (American Council of Snowmobile Association's weekly e-newsletter. ACSA is our national umbrella organization.

Article from the ACSA e-news on Friday, January 28th, 2022. We Need Your Involvement

Once again Congresswoman Carolyn Maloney (D-NY) has introduced the Northern Rockies

Ecosystem Protection Act, HR 1755. As crazy as it sounds with a New Yorker taking the lead on an issue in the Western United States, there are 54 Congressman that have signed on as co-



sponsors. You can see the Co-Sponsors by clicking here.

The legislation targets the lands in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington and Wyoming. It would prohibit any new road construction or reconstruction or timber harvest without an act of Congress. Oil or gas leasing, mining, or other development which impairs the natural and roadless qualities of the land is also prohibited.

HR 1755 will take all inventoried roadless systems and make them part of the Wilderness system. That's about 23 million acres! That is where we recreate!

A hearing is scheduled for February 15 in the House Natural Resource Committee. It is very important that the members on this Committee hear from you if you think this is not a good idea. The members of the Committee can be viewed here

https://naturalresources.house.gov/about/ourmembers. If your Congressman is not on the Committee and you would like to let your feelings be known, Congressman Russ Fulcher from Idaho, https://fulcher.house.gov is on the Committee and will glad accept your comments and enter them into the record.

Hard to describe the current state of our statewide snowmobile program. I've only been around since the late 2000's but I'm confident in saying we've never had a year, up to this point, where we've put more hours on groomers in eastern, South Dakota then what we have in the Black Hills. With these low snow conditions, tough decisions have taken place which impact the way we promote this snowmobile program and say Thank You to our current and former military.

The 4th Annual SDSU Veteran's Ride over Martin Luther King Weekend had to be cancelled for the second straight year. The 3rd Annual ride had to be cancelled last year due to SDSU Covid-19 protocols. While we are disappointed, we couldn't provide the opportunity for our current service men and women, along with our Veteran's, we are committed to the future of this event, like we know the snowmobile community is. This message was relayed to the Veteran's Affairs Office staff with SD State University, and we hope we can be together next year.

As most have already heard, it was decided to cancel this year's Governor's Ride for the same reasons the Veteran's ride was cancelled. Just saying that last line doesn't seem right, but the decision was made knowing trail conditions just weren't where they need to be to provide a great experience to our legislators. SDSA put a plan together which still allow the snowmobile community to reach out to all legislators and help promote the statewide snowmobile program.

We have had some clubs on the eastern side of the state perform a couple grooming cycles. This includes Aberdeen, Webster, Watertown, Milbank, Clear Lake, Brookings, and Sisseton. Some of these trail systems have since stopped grooming operations while others have been able to stay grooming once a week or so. I always like to remind those who participate in the GIA program for either the groomer operator or the trail administrator to let me know when trail conditions change. We are always looking for trail conditions which can range from: no snow, fair, good, great, or a combination such as good to great. We also need to post, the latest snow fall. Even if it doesn't mean you will be going out to groom, having the latest snowfall is good information to provide. The last thing we need to know is when you plan on grooming. These three pieces of information are important when planning your next snowmobiling trip and that's the information we want snowmobilers to have access too!




