

The only thing that was a hitch was the weather that no one has control over. But even that was getting people excited about



the prospects of a good winter season. I would also like to congratulate all the award winners this year for their dedication to our sport. Now remember to nominate people who are an example of dedication and sportsmanship for next year's convention December 1st and 2nd 2023 in Sioux Falls.

On the way home we went by two groups that were installing trail signs along highway 81. Hats off to those dedicated club members as it was only 22 degrees out at the time. Now this morning watching the news and weather I see that Watertown was white and snowing. Forecast for the hills was for a winter weather advisory for the next couple days. Temps are going to be low so whatever anyone gets will stick around for a while and hopefully build a base as the ground is freezing up.

There was some very good information brought out about some of the issues that we all need to be aware off regarding the Hills and trail systems in general. It has been brought up before and but mostly ignored is trespassing. We have been used to going pretty much wherever we wanted in the Hills but that is changing with a lot of the land owners selling off their property. Some of those new property owners are not friends of snowmobiling or any type of motorized recreation and are now trying to close off their property and want year round access. This is causing some of the roads to be plowed that were once trails in the winter and we are not to be on plowed roads forcing relocation of trails. Logging is also causing some of the trails to be moved. We will need to know our rights and respect their rights. So please pay attention to where you are riding and if it is posted stay out. Ask at the lodges as they might hear of areas that are said to be off limits. And contact the forest service if you run into any situation with a land owner so they can hopefully step in and help. Use common sense when going by housing areas. Remember the trails are not race tracks where speed and noise are common (especially by someone's home). This applies to the East and West trail systems.

Hope for a good winter, stay safe and ride smart.



Start making plans to attend the Deadwood Snocross January 27-28, 2023. It will be here before you know it.


February 4th is the BHSC annual Radar Run at Deerfield Lake. We always have a great time at this event with sleds running over 100 mph!


Back to the trail signing... as I was quickly perusing Facebook, a relative of mine shared this picture




make sure you tell them it is for the SDSA 2023 convention to get the discounted room rate of \$110. Think snow!! Ride safe!!

Just like that, it's already November. Fall harvest, various hunting seasons, football and other fall pleasantries are in full swing. We hope ditches full of snow and a Black Hills trail system receiving snow all winter long are in our foreseeable future. Of course, we want to make sure we have time to get signs in the ground before all that snow starts dropping on our trails.

This part of the article had to be rewritten after some poor road conditions hit this week, but mostly I ended up coming down with Covid. While cancelling the meetings that GFP always host at this meeting had a minimal



impact on the whole convention, not being at the convention was an eerie feeling honestly. As we look forward to next year's convention, moving on with day to day operations this year is still on track. We have some clubs who are close to finishing trail signing and others who will be getting started soon after the convention. The sooner we can get out to inspect, the sooner and hopefully warmer it is for any corrections to be made, so please contact me right away, when you know your whole trail is in. If you or any of the club members you have are involved with signing and would like to ride along, or you have a section that you consistently see comments from us, let me know and we can make sure both parties are on the same page. We hope with the updated guidelines, establishing your trails is easier than ever.

Due to Shannon and I not attending, we weren't able to distribute maps as we normally do. As I travel across eastern, SD for signing evals, I'll be coordinating with club members and dropping maps off myself. More maps can be requested by contacting me at Farm Island at 605-773-2885, or the Game Fish and Parks office in Watertown at 605-882-5200.

I haven't received all equipment and Grant-in-Aid agreements for the upcoming season yet, so if you haven't had a chance to sign those, please do so and send those in. I've already sent some grant request paperwork out to various clubs and continue to get that paperwork out as time allows. Remember, clubs with state owned equipment are allowed a 25% advance on the total grant that was approved to help keep you operating as necessary. If your club voted in a new Grant-In-Aid coordinator, please make sure they contact me so I can catch them up on the procedures of the grant and go through the paperwork with them. Usually, a 20–25-minute conversation.

It seems the Fall season is always hectic and turns into a race against time for both sides of the state. Please let me know if there is any way I can help take some pressure off your shoulders, especially those involved in the Grant in Aid program.

# SDSA Names Jon LaFramboise to the SDSA Hall of Fame

Jon LaFramboise has been associated with and riding snowmobiles for over 32 years, riding both in Minnesota and Wisconsin before he carried his passion for the sport west to the Black Hills and took that passion far beyond just riding.

When purchasing his first "new to him" sled, part of the purchase agreement was to join the Black Hills Snowmobile Club. In time Jon took on many leadership roles and ensured everything ran smoothly for the club's involvement with their Radar Runs, Ski for Light, Story Book Island and hosting the SDSA Convention in 2010 and 2020. Jon served two separate terms as Vice President and two separate terms as President of the Black Hills Snowmobile Club.

In August 2009, Jon was first appointed to the position of District 2 Director to complete the term of Ken Steiner. At the 2009 Convention, Jon was elected District 2 Director and continued to serve in that capacity until 2016. As Director, Jon's committee work involved planning and organizing the annual Governor's Ride as well as SDSA's involvement with the Sno Cross races in Deadwood. He



also worked with Government Relations, Bylaws and Right to Ride, Fundraising and Raffles, Investments, Awards and Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers. Jon was named Man Snowmobiler of the Year in 2010. Jon also served on SDSA's Planning Committee when SDSA hosted ISC 2016 in Rapid City. Jon was also a member of the Task Force for Youth when the YETIS organization was created and strongly supported the effort to give young snowmobilers a leadership experience and encourage their continued involvement in the sport. After at least 3 unsuccessful bidding attempts, it was at the 2020 Convention he finally had the high bid and took home an original John Green painting!

In 2015, Jon was elected to the position of President-Elect, serving two years, before being elected President of SDSA in 2017. During his 2-year time span as president, Jon was motivated to visit as many clubs as he could, whether it was for a monthly meeting, a poker run or to ride on their snowmobile trail. Best recollection is he met with the Sturgis Sno Drifters, Mile High Club, Aberdeen Driftbusters, Great Plains Snowtrailers, Town and Country Snowdrifters, Trailbusters, Whetstone Valley, Watertown Snowmobile Club, Northeast Trailblazers, Dakota Trail Blazers and Poinsett Pounders. At least 3 of these visits included a ride on the trail or in a poker run.

His motivation to be an informed and involved leader, also took him to 3 ACSA/DC Fly-ins and to 6 ISCs in Niagara Falls, Rapid City, Winnipeg, Halifax, Grand Rapids and Omaha. No doubt had COVID not cancelled the 2020 events, we could have said 4 Fly-ins and 7 ISCs. Jon finished his 2-year term as Past President in November 2021.

Once meeting Jon, it would not take long to realize that Jon worked hard, and he played hard. He donated tons of time, and some serious dollar amounts in his travels across the state and country for the benefit of SDSA and the sport of snowmobiling. His dedication to the sport was deep rooted as was his desire to maintain access to public lands, advocate safe snowmobiling and to promote the fun of snowmobiling with family and friends. When riding with groups of people Jon was always one of the leaders counting to make sure everyone was present and accounted for. Whenever someone got into a tight spot or got stuck, Jon was usually the first on the scene. He enjoyed helping others enjoy snowmobiling and made sure the new-to-the-sled ridders were comfortable and having fun.

To us, as SDSA members, his leadership abilities showed us that his convictions were strong and his explanations of why were clear. He was quick to wit and with one simple question or comment, he could take the conversation in a completely different direction, leaving us in a robust round of laughter. Yet at a tender moment, his voice may have cracked, and he probably paused for a tear before composing himself to carry on with the task at hand.


