
month the snocross races are in Deadwood. I hope to see a lot of people at the races and also stop by the SDSA booth. Until next month, hope to see you all on the trail

# Snowmobilers Taking The Pledge

HASLETT, MI, December 15, 2022:

The members of the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (Arctic Cat, BRP, Polaris, and Yamaha) are joining together again this season with the snowmobile community with the Take The Pledge campaign. The Pledge is designed to ensure snowmobilers protect existing riding areas and trail systems for current and future generations and landowners who give us access to their property. Those that take the pledge agree to the following:

- I Pledge to ride off trail only where I know it's legal and accepted.
- I Pledge to check before going off-trail if I don't know.
- I Pledge to protect access for future generations by doing the right thing.
- I Pledge to protect access by encouraging those I ride with to take the Pledge also. Snowmobilers enjoy over 120,000 miles of trails located on public and private land and have been built and maintained by snowmobile volunteers for over 40 years.

The record level of interest in enjoying the great winter outdoors demands our attention to the awareness of legal riding areas and making sure everyone with us knows the rules.

The International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association members invite every snowmobiler to take the pledge at www.snowmobilerspledge.com and encourage those they ride with to also take the pledge.

This year we have designed a logo for the Take The Pledge Campaign. Please use this logo on your websites, communications that you send out, Facebook page, etc. Encourage people to take the pledge. If they want, they can scan the QR code to be directed to the website or they can type in the website address directly. We will be making decals to send to interested parties that can be distributed at clubhouses, meetings, etc., so look for those coming soon (in English only at this time).

Well snowmobilers should be happy on both sides of the state with 3 different cells that came through South Dakota in about a 3-week span. Snow amounts at the time included anywhere between 5 inches and 5 feet. I want to take some time and thank the men and women who are on the opposite side, taking care of equipment and grooming operations as they deserve a big Thank You.



Starting in the Black Hills, when you get four to five feet of snow at once, it obviously brings challenges. The only way to go out is to hook two groomers up, without a drag and just pack the trail the best you can. You also hope to get some snowmobilers out to help pack those same trails. All in all, Shannon and his crew were called out for emergency situations, fought through multiple break downs, getting stuck and coordinating removing vehicles from the trail because they missed the signs. At this same time, you are training new groomer operators, which takes time as well. Overall, the operations in the hills have done an amazing job getting caught back up and meeting the high expectations of a world class trail system for the trail side businesses and snowmobilers from across this country. Obviously still challenges ahead but I know their happy to finally get a trail set and if you happen to run into one of these folks while snowmobiling in the hills, give them a thumbs up or Thank You if you see them in person.

Now the Eastern side of the state, where the same challenges I discussed above hold true along with some serious drifting! Unfortunately had more conversations than I can remember about groomers getting stuck, with and without a drag, repairs that needed to take place before grooming operations could begin again and battling drifts in the ditch anywhere from 8 to 12 feet tall. It's a huge task that falls on a select few within each club. Front differentials going out, heated mirrors, leaf springs and other repairs have halted operations in some communities. What never surprises me is how quickly these folks respond to get the equipment back up and running. Multiple clubs went out on emergency cases on the eastern side of the state as well, including 5 different times in one location. These groomers are specialized pieces of equipment and clubs pride themselves in being a large part in their local community. Again, my hats off to the many folks who groom and maintain their club's equipment and I thank you for the sacrifices I know you have when it comes to your own personal life to make sure your local trail system is groomed, when conditions allow it, and the equipment is ready to roll at any given moment. I promise you your work does not go unnoticed.

With the snow conditions we have, we look forward to hosting the special events that had to be canceled last year due to low snow conditions. The SDSU Veteran's ride in January, and Governor's Snowmobile ride in February. These are events that allow us to say Thank You to the men and women in our military and show case what Game Fish and Parks and the snowmobile community have created with over 5 decades of cooperation. We can't wait to host these events again.

of the Hill title and prize money of 500.00. This is a great time to bring




out the family to enjoy a day outdoors we have a concession stand available and a 50/50 drawing so there will be something for everyone.




