





President Duane Duerr called the meeting to order at 10:35 a.m.

Mary Anne called Roll call and established the following:

Duane, Kelly Greg (zoom), Mike (zoom), Ann, Tracey (zoom), Pat, Jason, Trace (zoom), Diane, & Mary Anne (zoom).

Guests: Jim Weaver, Al Nagel & Ryan Raynor. Mike made a motion to accept the agenda with Edward Jones being added to new business and Trail cam added to old business. Tracey seconded. Motion carried.

Greg made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Mike Seconded. Motion carried.

Presidents Report: Good year this year except for no snow. Our clubs seem to be busy and growing.

SnoPlainsman: The Quark program has been purchased after a lot of back & forth with the sales crews for it. Thanks to Diane for her assistance in getting that done.

Mary Anne checked into the extra cost for upgrading the magazine print. Going to 50# white instead of what we use would increase the print cost \$485 PER ISSUE. Assuming that would not be acceptable.

Trails – There are 14 clubs in the GIA program. Insurance \$ is up for all the clubs. Mitchell changed their trail which will involve the Parkston club. Shannon & Ryan will not be at ISC this year. GIA total \$314,211.

Gov. Relations – Thank you to Kelly for setting up the meetings with the legislators.

Convention – Nov 11 & 12 at Aberdeen. All Fun & Games. Ramkota rooms \$109.99 per nite. Identify as SDSA 2022. Food prices may go up and cause some issues but the club won't know that until 90 days prior. Registration is \$115. 16 teams will participate in the cornhole tournament. Move the social hour earlier and banquet as well to accommodate for the corn hole classic. They plan also to have a make n take class.

SOY interviews – Put on the form that if zoom interviews are absolutely necessary that they will be accepted.

Awards committee should work with Brian to align our awards with theirs.

Sioux Falls — Dec 1 & 2 2023 Sioux Falls Ramkota. 75 rooms blocked at \$110 each. Snow-mobiling Brings Family Friends & Fun. Vintage participation involving Interlakes Club. Hoping to have classes on avalanche, safety, GPS.

Fundraiser – Tickets are printed. Mailing out to presidents of clubs.

Financial – Currently \$11,798.57 in our checking. Mike made a motion to move \$50 in legal defense to the right to ride account. Kelly seconded. Motion carried.

Diane explained all the options on her reports. Do collapsed version or expanded? Do collapsed at convention and full report in February.

Tracey made a motion to approve the financial report and file for review. Greg seconded. Motion carried.

Awards – we will attempt to get ours on page with ACSA's guidelines.

Bylaws & Right to Ride SOPS need to be looked at prior to August meeting.

Safety – 9 certificates and 9 on line. 8 accidents with 2 fatalities

Charity – 15 clubs reported including SDSA. Totals included: Major Charities \$5,259.00 Local Charities \$46,892.14 Total Dollars \$52,151.14 Volunteer Hours donated to charities 7786.5; Volunteers involved in operation of trail 129 Number of Miles Groomed 1,497 Volunteer Groomer operators/mechanics 43 Number of hours operating trail 2,378

Scholarships: Kelly, Duane & Ann are on the scholarship committee. This year's winners were Blake Van Regenmorter from Town & Country Snowdrifters and Ryker Erstad from the Poinsett Pounders.

Gov Ride- Tumblers and swag were delivered to the legislators. This seemed to work out very well. Tracey Kelly & Brian delivered them. Pages distributed them for us. Visited with several in the house including Scott Simpsom from GFP. Save the dates were delivered and we'll see how 2023 goes.

Grants - We received the final \$500. ISMA's due date for applications is October 1.

Snocross – Check into the value of the sno cross booth. Perhaps we need to change our strategy. Online auction at convention needs to be researched and addressed. It would tie in with the website changes needed. Handbid/clickbid/ etc. Tracey Ann & Duane will work on this item.

OHV/Tracey reported the ATV assoc & FS went

through a public input session regarding issues such as trespass, garbage, etc. Tracey & Duane were among 50 who participated.

Keloland is willing to let us use their cameras on our website.

ISC Branded items. Last year we did trail maps and koozies. We are low on koozies.

Endowment Fund proposal: \$20,-\$25,000 in fund to give away a \$1000 scholarship to a Yeti each year. Johnny & Audrey Rider will put in \$500 to get it started. Wtn. Area Community Foundation pays 4% and would help disburse. Looking for the boards input. Referred to Scholarship committee to work on with Yeti input.

5 min bathroom break

Budget reviewed. Mike made a motion to accept the budget as presented. Ann seconded. Motion carried.

Investments. Met with Sprung to go over the investments. In order to "stop the bleed" it's suggested we move bond funds into an annuity for 3 years. Penalty if funds are withdrawn from this annuity. (\$26000 approx. moved to this).

Tracey made a motion to move the bond \$ to the annuity and give the committee the power to move the other funds as need if the stock market continues to move. Greg seconded. Motion carried.

Midwest Chapter Survey Guidance as to where do we go from here is needed. Benefits? Goals/direction? Dues? Dissolve? Duane spoke on his feeling that the chapter needs to be dissolved. Tracey agreed. Much discussion ensued.

Black Hills Snowmobile club is having an outing at kickstand camp June 25 outside of Sturgis. Dueling pianos is from 8 - 11.

Diane reported the new laptop is up and functioning.

Next meeting August 13. Ann will need a zoom

Tracey made a motion to adjourn at 1:47 p.m.



Over the years that I have been writing articles, I typically have at least 1 article in the season where I share Snow or Snowmobile Facts with you. So here's this year's Facts article. Shout out to the International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (ISMA) who gathers this information and puts it into a condensed version that can be easily shared.

Well designed, signed and maintained trails and riding areas not only provide enjoyable recreational snowmobiling opportunities but have been proven to significantly reduce the likelihood of a snowmobiler being injured. Safe trails and use areas remain a top priority and concern of the snowmobile community. Statistics indicate that only approximately 10 -15% of snowmobile incidents occur on well maintained and designed trails where as much as 80 -90% of all snowmobile riding takes place. There are approximately 136,000 miles /124,000 kilometers of signed and maintained snowmobile trails in North America that have been developed by snowmobile clubs and associations, usually in cooperation with provincial, state and local governments. Here is what the trail systems are across the Snow

- ☐ Destination —designed to go somewhere (to a point of scenic interest or recreation site, to connect nearby towns, etc.)
- ☐ Integrated Network designed to be part of a formal, long-distance, integrated network which links towns, counties, states and provinces.

A number of jurisdictions are now working to develop international, interstate and inter-provincial systems. It is now possible to ride 70% of North America's snowmobile trails through the continuous interconnections that exist.
