From SDSA's President-Elect

Kelly Weaver, Aberdeen, SD

Wow! I can't believe it is fall already. Even though the sleds have been stored away for the summer, snowmobiling has been pretty front and center this summer. Here's a quick update of the off season action.

During our SDSA May Board meeting, Ryan Raynor reported on the great snow year we had. It was a record breaking year for East River trails with more than 2,300 grooming hours and nearly \$200,000 in grooming expense reimbursements. We can't thank our groomers and trail volunteers enough. We should NOT be lacking for Groomer of the Year nominations at Convention this year! Fundraising tickets for the SDSA BIG Payout were distributed so now is great time to kickoff sales if you haven't already. Last year, SDSA had 669 individual/family members which is below our bud-



geted goal of 750 members. Let's take advantage of events this fall to capitalize on the excitement of last year's good snow year and increase membership.

It was with regret that we accepted Diane Hiles' resignation as SDSA Treasurer. She has done a great job keeping us all informed on SDSA's fiscal activities and will do an equally fine job of assisting her replacement as she transitions out at the end of 2023. The search is underway – please encourage club members with fiscal abilities to apply. Position details can be found at https://snowmobilesd.com/employment.

In June, South Dakota was well represented at the International Snowmobile Congress (ISC) in Moline, IL. This event brings together the American Council of State Associations (ACSA) and the Canadian Council of Snowmobile Organizations (CCSO) to talk about all things snowmobiling, inform us of regulations and laws affecting our sport, and share best practices for operating and growing our associations and clubs. A new initiative for ACSA this year is the creation of a Youth Ambassador Program. They are currently seeking input from 12-30 year olds. (see QR code in Tracey's article on page 27) International Snowmobile Manufacturers Association (ISMA) shared a report on the state of the industry. Together with about 400 of our snowmobile friends, we were able to celebrate SDSA members receiving awards this year. SDSA Secretary/Editor Mary Anne Grabow was inducted into the Iron Dog Brigade, and Elizabeth Brakefield of the Aberdeen Drift Busters was awarded the CJ Ramstad Memorial Scholarship. Congratulations, ladies!

We learned of funding opportunities which local clubs should consider. First of all, what club wouldn't want \$200 to throw a snowmobile party!!?? ISMA is offering clubs a \$200 grant to promote snowmobiling on Snowmobile Day (Saturday, October 28th). Several clubs applied last year and had a great time hosting events like a show and shine, safety training, or sled maintenance clinic to expose more people to our favorite sport. I challenge all clubs to apply- it's simple and due October 10: https://snowmobile.org/snowmobile-day-2023.html If your club is more ambitious and has a bigger project in mind, consider the Ski-Doo Snow P.A.S.S. (Protect-Access-Sustain-Support) grant for up to \$5,000 which is due September 15 at https://www.ski-doo.com/us/en/snow-pass-grant-program.html.

Membership was a continued topic of discussion at the August SDSA Board meeting,. We are investigating ways to direct riders to SDSA while out enjoying the sport such as placing QR codes with trail signs to direct folks to the SDSA website for information and membership application. We also discussed creating recognition opportunities for our clubs at the annual convention. For clubs who submitted GIA applications for their trail, the Snowmobile Advisory Council approved increases to reimbursement levels for trail expenses including signing, grooming and storage. GIA grant awards for the 2023-2024 season will reflect the increase.

Last fall a Master Planning Committee was created to review the operations and funding of the Snowmobile Trails program. Members are snowmobilers Dave Kennedy, Bruce Hintz, Todd Sprang, and Tracey & Brian Erickson along with GFP staff Shannon Percy, Al Nedved, Matt Snyder, and Ryan Raynor. The projected balance of the Snowmobile Trails Fund (which funds ALL snowmobile trail activity in South Dakota) is trending lower to negative in the next 5 years. Last year, the fund received revenue of just over \$741,000 which did not cover the expenses of nearly \$1,000,000. Even with a typical snow year, we are not generating enough revenue to cover expenses. The Advisory Council is in support of increasing sled licenses to \$20 per year and increasing the 5 day permit fee accordingly. An out-of-state user fee was discussed as well. Some of these changes will require legislative action so the changes will not be immediate but they will likely be imminent. Once the Master Planning Committee has done its research, expect changes in how our trails program is funded going forward and share your thoughts with your SDSA Board members.Look forward to seeing you at future snowmobile events and enjoy a great kickoff to the season.

On the Trails Ryan Raynor, Trails Specialist

I typically enjoy a nice cool Labor Day weekend in the park, but this year's Labor Day Weekend was way to hot. Hopefully we didn't see anymore 100degree temperatures in September. Always tough to transition between parks and snowmobile as the seasons mesh together in the spring and fall but I appreciate Mary Anne reminding me that my report was due.



As usual to start the year off I want to discuss what took place at our most important meeting of the year with the Advisory Council in August. We had

a healthy discussion about our budget and made some positive changes to our grant reimbursement rates as well. I won't dive into every single detail this article but over the next couple of articles I will continue to highlight the important parts of that meeting.

At the August council meeting, fourteen grants were approved for the 2023-2024 Grant-in-Aid program, with those grants totaling just under \$309,000. Thank You to the clubs and volunteers who do a wonderful job providing safe snowmobiling opportunities throughout eastern South Dakota. The council agreed to increase specific reimbursement rates which included the Grooming, Signing, Equipment Storage and Maintaining and Servicing Equipment. I'll talk more about this next month and provide more details about how those rates have changed.

Also approved at the meeting was the fiscal year 2025 snowmobile budget. Not much changed from the previous year as we hope to have our \$1.4 million dollar budget approved by the GFP commission later this year. The council was also updated about where the programs current trails fund balance is and where our fiscal year 2023 revenue and expenses ended up. Total revenue earned last year was just over \$853,000 where our final expenses came in just over \$1,217,000. This meant our Snowmobile Trails Fund went from \$916,256 to just over \$552,000. This fund balance is low compared to what we have averaged over the past 10 to 15 years so GFP's and the council understood we have some decisions to make over the next year.

The month of September is always busy with the necessary paperwork to keep the snowmobile season moving forward. This includes GIA and Equipment Agreements, DOT right of way agreements, and other necessary requirements. The agreements that GFP has with the state should be in the mail by late September and if those clubs could send back a PDQ, instead of mailing it back, you can certainly do so.

Don't forget to start getting sign requests into me right away and I know clubs start meeting this month so let me know and if my schedule allows, I can plan on attending. Shout out to the Sisseton club who's meeting I attend in early September.

When I was hired for the SDSA Treasurer position in June 2015, I pledged to stay in the position for 5 years. Well, it has been 8+ years and it is time for me to step away to be able to do other things, like grandkids, travel, sewing/quilting/embroidery, and fun stuff like that. In order to have an orderly transition for SDSA, I provided the Board with ample time to find a replacement, provide that

person with guidance and know how before being done on 12/31/2023. I was confident there would be someone amongst SDSA's membership that would be interested in being involved with SDSA and filling the position. Let me say that if you like snowmobiling and are passionate enough about keeping the sport alive, enhance all of that by becoming the next treasurer for SDSA.

About the position:

SDSA will provide a treasurer's laptop which is covered by a Total Tech subscription with Best Buy. This laptop is set up with Microsoft 365 (Word, Excel, Power Point, Publisher), Trend Micro and QuickBooks. The QuickBooks software is set up with a complete chart of accounts specific to SDSA's budget and financial reporting needs.

The Treasurer maintains the following accounts: General Account, Savings Account, Right to Ride Account, Legacy Membership Account along with the checking account for the YETIS and also for Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers. In addition, SDSA has investment accounts with Edward Jones. Each account has a specific purpose and use of funds.

Time spent on the Treasurer's functions will vary from month to month with each month paying a few monthly operating expenses and payroll. Deposits for membership dues and advertising income pick up with October, November and December being the busiest months for those deposits. Convention adds another level all its own with fundraising activities (live and silent auction, Big Payout raffle) along with a recap of all that activity. January, February and March continue with some membership dues and advertising income, but at a much slower rate as we head into the end of the season and to the end of the fiscal year in June.

The Board of Directors meets four 4 times requiring a current Treasurer's Report be prepared for each of the meetings, along with a proposed budget for the next year by the May meeting. Once the Fiscal Year has ended and the Board of Directors have accepted the final fiscal year report, that information is submitted for preparation of the current year's tax return (Form 990 and Form 990T). Payroll also involves www.snowmobilesd.com Sno Plainsman October 2023Page 16 quarterly 941 Reports, W2s and W3 along with SD Unemployment reporting and occasional MN Workmen's Comp reporting. And of course, writing an article for each issue of the Sno Plainsman.

The Treasurer is also charged with preparing the convention booklet that each of the delegates receive at the annual meeting. This book is prepared in Publisher with a template set up to basically cut/paste in the appropriate financial reports, meeting minutes, etc. Once the booklet is prepared, a professional printer is used to copy, staple and fold the booklet. This is just a brief summary of the duties and responsibilities of the SDSA Treasurer. A more detailed job description can be found at http://www.snowmobilesd.com/employment. I would be most happy to visit with anyone that may be interested in learning more about the position in consideration of submitting an application.

SDSA is headed in the right direction of improving the value of membership, benefiting that membership by working hard and working together with ACSA to ensure continuation of the sport for future generations. I don't remember my first snowmobile much because we didn't have it long. All I know is that it was green. My second snowmobile was a Polaris 120 that was red and blue. I can still remember watching my dad unload it and me riding around the yard. These early experiences have led me into a sport that I greatly enjoy and still participate in to this day. I have many memories of being in the mountains with family and friends riding until almost sunset. To this day I don't know why I love the sport so much. It could be the feeling of exploration, discovering new areas or the thrill of speeding down and an open meadow. Also, could be the deep powder days where everyone gets stuck. I think the fun comes with the people that you ride with, and the moment you experience together. There's no other place I would rather be than in the mountains, preferably on a snowmobile or hunting.

Snowmobiling is important to South Dakota for a few reasons. The first is it allows for motorized travel to places that normal vehicles can't go. An example would be if roads were closed down because of heavy snowfall. Snowmobile's would still be able to travel. If there is an emergency during that time, emergency personnel would still be able to travel by snowmobile or a different tracked vehicle. They also allow landowners to access and check their property when the snow is deep. Second, it's a part of the tourism industry and generates around \$130 million in one way or another for the state. One way snowmobiles generate money is through registration fees for residents and trail passes for non-residents. Around 14.5 thousand snowmobile's are registered in the state. Another way is by someone renting a Snowmobile. Also, when people travel to go, snowmobiling, they spend money on gas, food, and rooms inside of our state. There are multiple restaurants along the trails that riders stop by to fill up and get a bite to eat. If the state were to ban snowmobiling, many businesses would go bankrupt, and others wouldn't be able to afford staying open in the winter time. These businesses rely on snowmobilers to keep the doors open. The last reason is it gives the state something to be proud of with over 1000 miles of trails that are maintained for many to experience our beautiful state

• Forestry service will not approve widening of trails for ATV/UTV access in the Black Hills to accommodate larger UTV's being made.

• Some clubs are against ATV/UTV's on Snowmobile trails.

• SDSA not currently set up for Year-round activity with ATV/UTV's (Snoplainsman 7 issues per winter months, ATV/UTV safety training, etc.)

• ATV/UTV members would need to pay SDSA dues to be Members of SDSA or dues re-structuring would need to be considered to accommodate both.

• Clubs must provide ATV/UTV Benefits for those members joining. (ATV/UTV rides, poker runs, Benefit rides, safety training, meetings, etc.)

Bylaws – Right to Ride: Greg Nordstrom reported no changes to the bylaws. Some clarifications were made to the SOPS. Right to Ride – Duane touched on that with private land owners not wanting snowmobilers on their properties.

Facebook group – Tracey made a motion to close the Facebook group. Mike seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mike will post that it is closing and have it closed by April 1.


Black Hills Snowmobile Club will have an ATV Rally June 23 to 25.

Facts About Snowmobiling - 2023

Haslett, MI, August 7, 2023: As we begin the 2023-24 snowmobiling season, we thought you may be interested in the following facts while you are preparing to go ride this season:

1. Snowmobilers come in all ages. The average snowmobiler, however, is 54 years old.

2. The average snowmobiler last season rode 1,154 miles / 1,857 kilometers (a 4% increase in ridership compared to 2022.) The number of miles ridden, on average, is dependent on snow cover, so we will see if Mother Nature brings us more days of snow for riding this season.

3. Many snowmobilers belong to a club and participate in many of their club's events. Clubs hold great riding events, great parties, and are made up of wonderful people that become great friends. Join a club and have a great time!!!

4. About 50% of the people that snowmobile, trailer their snowmobile to their riding area. The other 50% ride from their home or cabin.

5. Snowmobiling is a family friendly activity. Most of all those responding to surveys report that they snowmobile with family and with friends and with club members.

6. Snowmobilers are outdoor recreationists all year around. Following is a list of recreational activities that snowmobilers participate in when they aren't out riding:

59% go ATV Riding 48% go Camping 51% go Fishing 57% go Boating 43% go Hunting 30% go Hiking 25% go Motorcycle Riding 29% go Golfing 18% go Personal Watercraft Riding 11% go Downhill Skiing 14% do other recreational Activities

Yes, we are a year around active group!

7. Approximately 85% of the snowmobilers are male.

8. Snowmobilers are a big part of the winter economic engine by spending an average of \$2500 each year going snowmobiling, traveling to their snowmobiling spot, and food, gas, and lodging. In many places of North America, snowmobilers pay the bills for people involved in the Winter Tourism Industries and related businesses.

9. To help snowmobilers promote their sport, the snowmobile manufacturers have created a number of supporting communication tools.

c. We have two websites: www.snowmobile.org and www.gosnowmobiling.org that contain a lot of information, links, downloadable materials, etc. to help support you and educate you on key issues related to snowmobiling and help you better know the activities going on. Our websites are connected to other websites around the world including all of the United States and Canadian State and Provincial Snowmobile Associations which contain all of the local information that you may need.
