the Ride Command program and should be a very informative session. Also a make and take craft project.



Another winter is fast approaching and both sides of the state are seeing a lot of activity on the trails. While we had a two-week spell of below average temperatures, Mother Nature graced us with some beautiful days to get signs in the ground and start marking trails.

I've had many sign orders come in over the past few weeks and folks have been asking about timelines when they will be delivered. Orders typically take between 2 and 3 weeks so we need to make sure and plan accordingly if we are needing those signs for this season.



I was able to go around and complete equipment inspections last month and appreciate how well this equipment is taken care of. In most cases I've been able to meet with a local club member and I appreciate those folks talking time out of their day to go through needed maintenance and repairs. From those reports I was able to order parts for various club's and those parts should have been delivered by the time you read this. I ordered a lot of boggie wheels this fall. The poly coating wears off and the steel will eventually wear through on the track. Make sure to keep an eye on those throughout the season as tracks are not only expensive but take time to order from the factory to our doorstep.

I'm looking forward to this year's state snowmobile convention in Sioux Falls. Great opportunity to interact with a lot of folks about the up-and-coming season and even solve some of the world's problems. Shannon and I will be putting on a groomer school on Friday as well. We want to make this more a back-and-forth discussion and not just us presenting over a power point presentation. Diane Hiles, SDSA Treasurer

The results of the Charity Report taken for the 2022-2023 reporting period were presented at the International Snowmobile Congress in Moline, IL in June. There were 3 Canadian Provinces and 12 US States that reported.

South Dakota ranked 5th highest in total charity contributions at \$45,190; \$10,720 to Major/National Charities and \$34,470 to Local Charities. We were also 4th highest in hours donated at 6,876.

We had 11 clubs report, down from 14, up from 10 the previous year. South Dakota can be very proud of the charity work that our clubs and our individual members are involved with across the state. Here is what was submitted for South Dakota.


On another note: The Siouxland Sno Trackers s have been working hard to bring us the 54th Convention for SDSA. We hope to see a great turnout for our annual event.
