ACSA UPDATE

New Year -- New Challenges

As we start 2024, we must look forward to the challenges before us.

The Biden Administration has clearly laid out their priorities, from 30 x 30 to Endangered Species to reducing fossil fuel use. These issues all have a likely possibility of impacting snowmobiling.

Our goals must include remaining vigilant, being willing to participate - from writing letters to attending meetings, and working together. This is the time to unite. Snowmobilers must work with snowmobilers - snowmobilers must work with other motorized user groups - snowmobilers must work with other trail groups with similar interests and use.

Work with the land managers in your area. Get on their mailing lists. Listen to their issues and their priorities. Get the dates/times of upcoming meetings and do your best to be sure snowmobiling is represented. If your Association or Club does not have a Land Access/Land Use Committee, it might be a good time to consider forming one.

There is strength in numbers. There is strength in information.

There are many Congressmen and Senators not seeking re-election. Many of them will be looking for "legacy projects". Wilderness designations are often at the top of that list. We will need to vigilant in paying attention and expressing our views.

The DC Fly-in will be in April. This is always a good time to hear from the leadership of the agencies as well as meet with your state's elected representatives. ACSA considers this the most important meeting we hold during the year.

Remember, your elected officials are home at least one week a month. Introduce yourselves to their local offices and key staffers. Let them know who you are and what your priorities and concerns and why they do have an impact on snowmobiling and motorized sports. Let them know you are a knowledgeable and willing resource.

Happy New Year.....2024 will be a challenging year for us.


weather is predicting snow this weekend and throughout the following week so I guess we'll just have to cross our fingers!






Lee Olson, District 3 Director
