from snowbelt states in the West, we hosted a panel of snowmobile business people - aftermarket and clothing companies, local dealers and guides, and snowmobile media. It was informative to hear their level of understanding of our snowmobile organizations and issues facing the sport. Concerns mentioned include the cost of entry to the sport and the need for local, state and national organizations to be more visible in media. We need to communicate why clubs are important and to find ways to invite, engage and educate those new to the sport. Building relationships with other partners such as media, National Forest Services, and industry related businesses was highly encouraged. The social benefits of our organizations should not be understated.

Your SDSA board has been busy, snow or not, and I thank them for all the efforts they have been involved in this year. Thanks to the members of the Sno Cross Committee, YETIS members and other volunteers for manning the SDSA booth at two events this year. The weather for both events has been unseasonable warm which encouraged attendance and interactions. We were excited to raffle off a new 200 cc MXZ sled on the final day of this year's races. Thanks to all who bought tickets and to the winner Jim Dobbyn of North Dakota.

Thank you to the Governor's Ride Committee for working to organize the event only to have it cancelled due to lack of snow. They pivoted and se-

cured the information to present to the legislators before session ended this year. Put the 2025 Governors Ride on your calendar for February 8, 2025!

Thank you to the Scholarship Committee who are busy evaluating scholarship applications for our two \$500 SDSA scholarships as well as two YETIS scholarships that are being offered for the first time. We received the most applications we've seen in recent years.

Thank you to our staff, Mary Anne and Lisa, who have been very helpful to me and take care of our members!

A couple months into my term, some very key issues are coming into focus that will demand attention in the coming year. As I have been writing about in previous months, one key issue is the need to revisit our Snowmobile Trails Program funding structure. Please take time to educate vourself and fellow snowmobilers on how the fund works and why the increases are needed. Another key issue is the involvement and development of the next generation of snowmobilers. It is fantastic that we now have an endowment in place for the Jon LaFramboise YETIS scholarship. Now, we need to re-energize the YETIS group across the state. Please help is identify the youth 12-20 who are part of your club. An application can be found on the Forms page of the SDSA website.

Snow season (if we can call it that!) may be coming to an end but snowmobile work continues. The DC Fly-In organized by the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) is set for April 27-30, and the International Snowmobile Congress will be held June 13-15 in Green Bay, WI. Several of the board manned the Sno Cross booths both in Deadwood and also in Sioux Falls. Board members: Thank you for all that you do for SDSA.


Fly in has been scheduled for April 27-30. I know Kelly's already booked her tickets to make sure that she is there representing us.

The last SnoPlainsman article of the year and this one just feels different then years past. After a great 2022-2023 season on both sides of the state, we really got hit with a dud in 2023-2024. While a few clubs out east had some good snow conditions, it only lasted a few weeks. Unfortunately, the hills just couldn't get off the ground either and while we all know March can bring some good snow, we know for sure it won't last long.


If you got the chance to skim through my article last month you saw that I shared some information about our trails fund balance and revenue streams. With my final article of the year, I wanted to share some info about Expenses vs Revenue and explain our budget in a little more detail.



The Snowmobile budget operates based on many of the same principles as other state agency budgets. Our budgeting year is based on a fiscal year or July 1st, through June 30th. Our budget is broken down into specific categories, all of which include Employee Salaries & Benefits, Travel, Contractual Services, Supplies & Materials, Grants, and Capital Assets. I won't dive into these weeds to deep, but I do think it's important to note that employee salaries and benefits have been the only reason why our snowmobile budget has gone up over the past few years. The other categories mentioned above have remained the same. Our budget authority is just over \$1.4 million, where 70% of the budget goes towards the Black Hills and the remainder falls in line with the Grant in Aid Program and administrative expenses. Our budget lives and dies by snowfall, the more snow that falls, the more we spend as grooming rotations takes place along with other expenses.

Last month I covered our 3 main sources of funding, but I'll share a graph with you below as well that will show the ebb and flow of both revenue and expenses.

At the end of the day, when you look at this graph, you'll see a trend, like my last article where you saw a trend of our fund balance dropping over a recent period, similar trends you'll notice with this graph. Our revenue just isn't keeping up with expenses like it used too. For many years, when we had good snow, our revenue fell right in line with it. That just isn't the case anymore and it's time we bring a fresh look to our snowmobile funding sources. These discussions started last summer with the Advisory Council and SDSA and will continue this summer without a doubt.











Eastern Iron Dog Ride 2024 Chris Gamache February 4, 5, 6 & 7, 2024


Chris Gamache, Iron Dog since 2016, reporting on the Eastern Iron Dog Ride 2024.

I know many don't have snow to talk about, but we had 2 great days of riding. In total we had 11 Iron Dogs in attendance. Gail Hanson, Paul Bergeron, Jim and Bonnie Holbrook, Roger Wright, Dan Gould, Terry Callum, Dottie and Charlie Kurtz, Ross Antworth and myself. We were joined by some other guests (Ross's wife Claire, my wife Kristina, NH Trails Bureau Dist. 1 Supervisor Clint Savage, past NHSA Presidents Craig Mayo and Russ Davis and a prospective Pup, Brian, from the Lyme Pinnacle Snowmobile Club.

Monday 13 sleds, 11 of them were Dogs, made a 116 mile ride from Gorham to Errol, NH for lunch and then west to the Nash Stream Forest and back to Gorham. Trails were beautiful and we had blue skies the entire day. The local clubs had been out grooming the routes we were riding, and we had no bad trails at all. We all met for dinner that night and had a great time telling stories.

On Tuesday we rode about 80 miles from Gorham to Twin Mtn, NH and had lunch at the Cog Railway Base Station. While there the Manager offered to have the Dogs take a free trip up the winter train. This just opened 4 years ago, and they are looking to get more riders to their restaurant and mountain train (it opened in 1892). There were 12 of us at lunch so they comped us \$600 in train tickets.

The owner of the RR is paying to have the trail built and maintained to their location. 8 sleds made the Tuesday trip and 5 of the riders were Dogs. Another blue sky day with near perfect trails (except for about 6 miles of rough stuff, but you can't have perfect trails everywhere or you start getting



flat, trails for us on both days.

I have 50 delegates for the clubs and 8 members of the board for a total quorum of 58 officially established.

Financial report – Diane gave her final financial report which was filed for review.

President's Report - Duane gave his final president's report. Last year we had snow and it was so much easier to be President in the presence of snow! He was able to go to DC Fly-in. Duane came to the conclusion that this is money well spent by SDSA.

Mary Anne gave her report for the Sno Plainsman citing her 20 years with SDSA as of January 1, 2024... and showing that our advertising was up dramatically over what we had hoped for. We exceeded budget by quite a bit!

YETIS- Chris gave a report on the YETIS. Corbin Boock President; Lily Smith Vice President; Ted Smith Treasurer; VanDenHemel SDSA & Governor's Advisory representative. Government Relations Wolverine declared an endangered species. These kinds of things affect riders and the riding areas.

Investments are at Edward Jones. The funds came from hosting ISC in 2004 & 2016. \$122,754 in the account. Initially we were at \$90,000.

Welcome to 2024! I am Bert Miller from Wyoming and currently serve as the President of the American Council of Snowmobile Associations. ACSA is the national organization that was formed to unite the snowmobile community. Because snowmobiling is enjoyed by millions of individuals across the United States, it was imperative that a strong national organization be formed. ACSA is the eyes and ears for snowmobiling in Washington, DC and the voice for snowmobiling on national issues.



Looking forward, snowmobiling is facing many challenges in Washington, DC. "30x30" is a Biden program that aims to have 30% of all federal public lands and waters protected/conserved by 2030. We are currently at about 12% of public lands that meet that criteria. Many National Forests are beginning Travel Management Planning across the country. It is very important to have snowmobilers actively engaged in this process. You can always count on the non-motorized communities to be well represented. This can be a long and boring process, but one that is vitally important to maintaining our access.

What other tools are this administration going to use to help them in their land grab across the US? As we ended 2023, we saw the new Endangered Species listing of the Wolverine and the Canadian Lynx. We are also hearing there will be new Endangered Species Act language proposed by spring. ACSA will keep the snowmobile community updated on current legislative and/or regulatory threats through the weekly E-News. The E-News is emailed weekly, and if you are not currently receiving it, you can go to www.snowmobilers.org to sign up.

If you are currently caught up in some access issues and are looking for resources with science to back them up, visit www.snowmobileinfo.org. This website provides a wealth of knowledge and very valuable resources for your use.

If you are a member of a snowmobile club, your state association and/or ACSA – Thank You! The more you learn – the more valuable you are when snowmobile issues end up in your back yard. Thank you for volunteering! Your hard work is appreciated!

Not much to report for snow in the Northern hills, hopefully we can get some kind of moisture this spring.

I've been going to snowmobile dealer open houses for decades and try to attend their avalanche courses they put on. It seems I learn something new or at least remember something new every time. Next week I will be attending an AIARE Level 1 course to get some hands on training. At least there will be some snowmobiling involved. The Black Hills Snowmobile club had their annual club ride in Dubois Wyoming. Averaged around 20 riders for 3 days of riding and no damaged sleds, so that is always a plus.

The Black Hills club got the bid for the 2025 Convention December 5th and 6th.

By now most of you have heard or read about the possibility of fees going up for residents and/or added for non-residents. Articles have been written in the Sno Plainsman the last couple months, so I won't go into all those details. Not much has changed since the 70's with the exception of the gas tax off of 125 gallons of gas for every registered snowmobile in the state was increased from 100 gallons several years ago. The current system has worked better than most every other state in the snow belt for almost 50 years. Back in the day, GF&P trails program was self-insured (not sure about now), meaning if something happened at Hardy camp and the groomers were destroyed there was no insurance, they had to use the trail funds to replace the machines. Because of this, the trail fund always had a substantial amount in those funds. Back a couple decades ago other state's Legislatures started dipping into their trail funds for other programs, essentially destroying their snowmobile trail programs. Because of this, GF&P was afraid that if they tried to increase or implement fees to non-residents, the legislatures would see the substantial amount in the trail fund and possibly want to dip into it for other things. Fast forward to the last few years with the increased cost of basically everything and the lack of registered snowmobiles because of the poor snow conditions, the trail funds have been depleted to the point that something needs to happen sooner rather than later.

Hope everyone has a good summer!






