## Kelly Weaver, SDSA President



With the first club meetings under our belt, it's starting to feel like snowmobile season despite the record temperatures leading into October! I have begun making the rounds to visit with local clubs. Each has its own personality but many common topics

are on the agenda... holding events to raise the profile of the club and gain memberships, considering involvement in community projects based on availability of club volunteers, planning winter rides and races and, last but not least, betting on a good snow year to pull it all off.

I hope all clubs are making plans for the SDSA Convention coming up on December 6-7 in Brookings. There is so much good information to learn about our sport at the meetings and educational activities so take advantage of it all and then continue the conversations in the hospitality rooms. The Dakota Drifters have been working hard to bring you a great time! Here's your checklist for the convention:

- Get registered and invite a club member who's never attended to join in the fun.
- Nominate club members for the various snowmobiler of the year award show them your appreciation for their efforts!
- Gather some auction items for the SDSA auction.
- Gather your questions for the Roundtable with the President on Friday at 5 pm. Sharing ideas & questions helps each club and our state association better serve our members and mission.

At our August meeting, the board discussed raising our Legacy Membership Dues to \$750 and will be bringing this to the General Membership meeting. When the program began in 2013, the \$500 membership was to cover 10 years of dues for active members (\$20 at that time) with the balance (\$300) to be used for promotion of the sport. \$350 for dues and only \$150 for promotion of the sport. The primary use of these promotion funds has been to support our booth and presence at the annual SnoCross events in South Dakota, likely the largest gathering of snowmobile enthusiasts in the state. A large majority of current Legacy members are active members.

On October 1st, Mike Boock, Darin Cooper, Jackson Wenger and I had the opportunity to meet with our new Black Hills National Forest Supervisor, Shawn Cochran, and Motorized Trails Superintendent Jeffery Burdine at their Custer headquarters. We shared information about SDSA, our clubs, our national connections and the snowmobile trail program and funding. We talked about issues facing snowmobiling and how we can work together to find solutions. OHV travel was one of those issues and how it is having impacts on snowmobile travel options even though snowmobiles have little to no impacts on the trails. We confirmed that the Forest Plan revision process will continue. The Assessment Phase was completed in 2022 and the Revision Phase will begin in earnest next spring. This is where you come in..... there will be opportunities for public comment and we need to be diligent about engaging in the process to not only to raise any concerns but also to support good plans being proposed. Watch for communications on this issue through the SDSA information channels. Many of these opportunities will be time sensitive so be prepared to respond accordingly. Forest Planning is driven by local input so shame on us if we don't participate! More details on the process and recordings of the Assessment Planning meetings, be found can https://www.fs.usda.gov/detail/blackhills/landmanagement/planning/?cid=FSEPRD955187. It was a great meeting, and we look forward to continued communication with the Forest Service. We are hoping to get Forest Supervisor Cochrane out on his first snowmobile ride at the Governor's Ride in Feb-




## SDSA President-Elect Mike Boock

Hello snowmobilers!

Winter is here! Or is it? It was almost 100 degrees the other day. What is going on? Hopefully, by the time this gets published, snow will be flying somewhere!

I want to discuss trespassing in this article. Trespassing is the number 1 issue with both snowmobiles and OHV's. I really don't understand this

because most of the areas that are off limits are marked as such. It's pretty simple, if the sign says "No trespassing"... Stay out. If the sign says "Stay On Trail"... stay on the trail!



If the trail is marked and you disregard the sign, you are trespassing and can/should be fined. I think some people never got the memo that the forest is NOT "open unless designated" anymore, it is now "closed unless designated". You must use Avenza maps or OnX in the Black Hills. Yes, OnX is now also accurate for trails that are open. The forest service has recently been working with OnX and deleted all the old trails that are no longer legal trails. Just because you rode an area/trail last year, does not mean it's still open. Trails close or get rerouted every year because of logging, endangered habitat, land ownership changes, etc. Please get an updated map, learn how to read it, and use it. Those that want to keep the forest closed to motorized vehicles love it when we break the law, and they can report us. It helps their cause. By trespassing, you are breaking the law and hurting ALL off-road travel. As you prepare to ride in the Black Hills or the eastern trails of SD, remember to look at your map as several trails have been changed. There are so many buggies riding ditches up by Lead that the SD DOT now doesn't want to grant us access to the ditch right-of-way anymore. This will affect trails in the future. Last year, we almost lost access to the Buckhorn bar and grill. This year, we almost lost access to Rec Springs and Lead and Deadwood. They are watching us closely and documenting everything we do wrong, so it's time we all chip in and help out.

If you see something... say something. Follow the rules so we can ALL can continue to ride the areas we love. Praying for snow!

## Join a club and Build Memories, enjoy the

In 1979 I bought my first snowmobile a John Deere Spitfire 340. I had 8 friends that I grew up with and we snowmobiled nearly every week. We traveled to Park Rapids, MN. several times each winter and rode locally many times a week. Locally we had no groomed trails, but we had a good time. Soon I outgrew the spitfire and moved up to 440 John Deere Liquefier. For many years I rode this sled with our group and travel again to Northern Minnesota to ride. Being single then we stay in Bemidji, MN and went skiing while in Bemidji. We took beginner lessons as we thought the instructors were cute, we knew how to ski but you wouldn't know it watching us. I remember one really cold morning one of our group trying to warm his sled to start it using a hair dryer... It does not work at 20 below zero. Soon as we got older each of us got married and snowmobiling took a break to raising kids and work.

After moving to South Dakota I join the Sioux Falls Sno Trackers, purchased a Polaris 700 RMK and began riding in South Dakota and the Black Hills. Together Pat and I had seven kids so traveling to snowmobile was a big task. All of our sleds then required jetting, changing clutch weights and fixing. It was fun belonging to a club a having friends to ride with. The first time I rode in the hills Pat put me in charge of leading the family on a ride. I had no Idea where the trail went and being a guy did not like to read maps. As you can guess we went left when we should have gone right and ended up lost. We finally got headed in the right direction, but it soon got dark and very cold. We learn about warming shelters, keeping together and reading maps. Many of our tanks said empty but the sleds kept going. Finally, before search and rescue went out looking for us we returned to Rec Springs. We survived but we learned a lot about proper riding prep, planning your rout and telling someone where you are going.

I soon learned how to put on safety classes in our club and helped more people learn the value of Safe Riding. For many rides I led the group with no problem and soon learn the way to develop new leaders was to have them lead. Some rode to get miles in every day while others rode for the sites and the stops. Keeping snowmobiling safe is important. I learned Spearfish Canyon has great Hot Chocolate, While Buckhorn has great food and is a site to see. Watch out they say the Bear bites so don't touch him. I wonder how many dollars are on the wall and ceiling? Rec Springs can be rough to get back on the trail but is a great place to stay and eat at. I have seen Elk, Deer, Coyotes on the trails. I have had great Governor's rides at Hardy Camp with awesome breakfast.

I served as club president, as a director with SDSA, Vice President, President and now past President. While hosting a Convention I won the Big Wins drawing and that is why I have the Ski Doo renegade 900 Ace. I have seen many sites:


- Yellowstone Park


As I look at temperatures for mid-October, temperatures are way well above average. This has been the trend through most of September and now into October. These temperatures aren't screaming snowmobile season, but Shannon and I have been busy with the snowmobile program so below is a little update on how we continue to prep for the season.

Over the last few weeks, Shannon and the rest of the Black Hills Trails Office staff have been busy hosting 600 bikers for their annual Trail Trek on the Mickelson Trail. This is a four-day event which takes all year to plan for. Once Trail Trek is over, they head down to Custer to help at the annual Custer State Park Buffalo Roundup. A busy couple of weeks for the office trying to switch over to snowmobile operations but progress still moves forward one phone call, email, or text message at a time. A few weeks ago, we started working with our communications team to develop this year's snowmobile map. This includes getting reroutes from both sides of the state into Game Fish and parks staff who work out of our administrative office in Pierre. This also includes updating the business directory on the western side of the state, updating the image, and reviewing other fonts, colors, and layout schemes that we think would be an improvement. As always, our goal is to have these maps in hand to bring for the state convention.

I've sent in Department of Transportation Right Away agreements and hope to start getting those back and signed by a variety of DOT offices across the state. These agreements are vital to the east river program as it's not a right for the trail system to be in the right of way. It is a privilege and one we need to make sure to respect these agreements and meet our deadlines of beginning signing and removing signs at the end of the season. I also now have 2 different county right of way agreements to apply for. These agreements are very similar to DOT's right of way agreements.

5-Day Temporary permits, snowmobile motorcycle permits, and commercial permits have been or-

dered. 5-Day Temporary permits mostly go to vendors in the hills, but we are distributing these on the eastern side of the state so at least every trail system has one location where they can be found.





where we are trying to tackle 3 specific subjects over the winter. These include, promotional opportunities, small survey to figure out the number of non-residents visiting us each year, and hopefully get a contract signed for an updated Economic Impact Study. Progress varies with each subject but as winter creeps closer, we spend more and more time on moving these matters forward.

Last thing is scheduling equipment inspections for the eastern side of the state. I enjoy traveling to the clubs who do a great job taking care of this equipment. It's a good time to get caught up on your needs for grooming equipment before the season gets here.

In closing, as club meetings continue to take place, make sure you are reviewing your signing needs, and you get those orders to me asap. These orders can take a couple weeks, at times, and we want to make sure you have what you need by November, when signing takes place.

Awards: No report

Membership & Website. Numbers are in MaryAnne's report. Doing great for no snow. Venmo is still needed.

Bylaws & right to ride – no report

**Safety** – 5 accidents in the Hills in the short season we have so far. Do the rental companies educate? Go to snowobileinfo.org for information to educate others. Share through facebook, perhaps!

Charity – Report due April 1. Trails Specialist:

#### Black Hills Update:

- Due to poor snow conditions, minimal grooming rotations have taken place.
- The Black Hills Trails has had 8 accidents so far this year, 2 of those were in Wyoming but near our trails we manage.
- Received new Arrowhead drag and had to make some modifications but only been out once so further grooming necessary to truly test this drag
- Not the best year for it but staff has been tracking specific parking lots and trailheads and tracking the number of nonresidents compared to residents.
- Had a meeting with all Districts on the Forest to use as a introduction to the Snowmobile Program. There has been a tremendous turn over in em-

ployees for the Forest Service in all Departments.

Met with the Hell Canyon District about the Parmelee Timber Sale on the southern end of the Forest. For the next four years our southern trails will change dramatically. We are looking at losing trails 12b, 13, 9 and parts of trail 12. We will have one large loop to the south. Shannon will have maps at the spring meeting to discuss in further detail. I will need to bring up counsel to speed on the timber quantities, bat habitat now on our forest and how it will impact our trails on the Forest.

#### East River Update:

- Only a handful of clubs have groomed including, Mitchell, Brookings, Sioux Falls and Beresford and Aberdeen. These grooming rotations lasted between 1 to 3 weeks before conditions deteriorated.
- Best snow conditions in the state were probably in Beresford area for about 3 weeks. Also had to work with local Law Enforcement on this trail system to stop a landowner from purposely dumping snow on the trail.
- 3 Arrowhead drags have been ordered and we expect to be delivered by the end of the month.

#### SDSU Veteran's Ride:

• As you know, this ride was cancelled. While poor snow conditions existed at the time, it was really the extreme cold (-70 Wind chill at Hardy Camp this weekend) that forced us to can-

cel this years event. Trailshead cancellation policy meant we still paid for full price of the sleds, \$3K.

#### Legislative Update:

- As you may know a bill was introduced back in 2011 which allowed land owners or lessee's to shoot a coyote from a snowmobile as long as the snowmobile was stationary and no one else on it. This bill also stated they could not use the snowmobile to harass, chase, or runover that coyote.
- Senate Bill 14 was introduced by Senator Mehlhaff from Pierre titled "Expand authorization for the conditional taking of coyotes from snowmobiles." The intent of this bill is to expand the current law for Landowners and Lessee's to allow Guests to shoot a coyote from a snowmobile. The original version of the bill stated nothing about harassing or running over the coyote as a guest. GFP requested an amendment to add that the guest could not chase down, harass or run over the covote with the snowmobile which matches language from the original bill. That amendment was passed. Currently this bill, as amended, has passed both the house and senate chambers and is expected to be signed into law as session continues.

Hoping to pursue an increase in licensing fees working with SDSA and also Governor's Advisory Council in the future. Jeff is willing to meet with SDSA when they come to the capitol. Advisory Council approved: Resident fee increase from \$10 to \$20. Increase 5 day from \$40 - \$50. More research needs to be done before putting a number on the non resident fee possibility. Discussion was held as to the procedure to getting this through the legislative process.

Scholarship: No report. Jon LaFramboise YETIS scholarship form is on the website. Question that gets asked is different. Mike asked if we could do two scholarships this year. Much discussion was held regarding the scholarship. We will revisit under the old business.

Governor's Ride: Mike talked to Julie. Snow is horrible. The trail is dirt. Λ There's been some light dustings. Trailshead webcam got 45,000 hits in January. Mike's had several phone calls as well. GR Committee needs to get together and figure out the legislators gift.

**Snocross** – 165 tickets sold plus 1 membership;213 tickets and 2 memberships.

If one is drawn that says we win – re-draw! What is the cutoff # to draw? Is it the full 1000 tickets. The flags were great that Mike ordered.

**YETIS**: Corbin was at Sno Cross representing YETIS & SDSA. Hope to get some YETIS at the Sioux Falls Sno Cross too.

Name change was completed for the YETIS scholarship which is now known as the Jon LaFramboise scholarship. Consensus is that someone can get BOTH the SDSA scholarship AND the Jon LaFramboise scholarship if their submission is the best. The \$30,000 from Jon's business partner was received so the fund is currently at \$44,500. Currently the figure is 4% of the total that we can award. Mike made a motion to do a one time \$500 Jon LaFramboise scholarship for this year. This would be a SEC-OND scholarship along with the \$1000 that will already be awarded! Jason seconded the motion. Motion carried. When scholarships are awarded perhaps use a logo of TrueForm-Construction – in the photo.

YETIS need to be promoted more at club level. We'd like to see the YETIS grow their membership. Chris was asked his opinions on how to do this.

Short break at the 2 hour mark.

**QR Code** – is set up and goes

to a page that says "donation" and can be used for raffle tickets. Jason used his personal Venmo at the Snocross. Venmo is 1.9% plus 10 Cents. We need to set up a venmo account. Mike will work with Lisa on getting the Venmo set up.



#### **Darin Cooper, District 1 Director**

Well, it's that time of the week again. It sure seems like I just wrote an article last week anyway. Definitely not feeling like fall yet, been in the 90's pretty much since June. Drove between Gillette and Buffalo Wyoming a couple weeks ago and saw all the scorched land-scape from the big fires this summer. Pretty crazy to see miles and miles of black ground. Now there is a big fire by Dayton Wyoming. the road up to Bear Lodge resort was even closed.

Kelly Weaver, Mike Boock, Jackson Wenger and I went to Custer to visit with the new forest supervisor for the Black Hills Shawn Cochran. I think the meeting went really good. It was mostly to introduce ourselves and to inform Shawn on how the snowmobile

trail system works and some of the challenges we face. He seemed to take in everything and was very welcoming. Shawn did say that they are looking at revising the forest service plan for the Black Hills. it will take approximately 2 to 3 years to implement, with public input starting sometime next spring.
