On my way home from the 55th Annual SDSA Convention in Brookings, my body is tired but my heart is full! In the words of Coach John Stiegelmeier, I can honestly say snowmobilers are truly MAD (Making A Difference)!

Not only do we raise money for SDSA, our generous snowmobilers raise money for great causes. Friday night featured a special gun raffle for the benefit of our Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers fund. The gun was donated by Charlie Fawcett and his family. Charlie, a cancer survivor from Miller, was the beneficiary of the Snowmobilers for Snowmobilers program, and this was his way to pay it forward. South Dakota Arms in Miller beautifully engraved the gun stock with SDSA and Snowmobilers

for Snowmobilers logos. An embossed leather scabbard was also donated by Shamrock Holsters. A winning bid of \$2,700 from Kim Raap will allow more snowmobilers who experience hardships to receive assistance. An additional \$3,412 was contributed by the Aberdeen Drift Busters Snowmobile Club and Karen's Bar and Grill in Columbia, SD. The Town and Country Riders contributed another \$1,000. If you know of an SDSA member facing a hardship, you can find an application on the Forms page of the SDSA website.

Contributions made over the last year to fully fund the Jon LaFramboise YETIS Scholarship endowment have produced enough revenue to fund TWO \$1,000 scholarships for the program. Applications for this scholarship and the two \$500 SDSA scholarships are due on February 25th. The American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) scholarship is due February 1. Applications for all three scholarships can be found on the Forms page of the SDSA website. So many good things happened at this convention which was superbly executed by the Dakota Drifters! I can't thank the SDSA staff and board members enough for all they do to make the convention a success — before, during and after. If you think you are tired after the convention, I challenge you to follow Mary Anne around for a day during the weekend!

Thank you to each person or business who donated items, bid on the auctions and bought raffle tickets. The fundraisers were all successful and are the most significant source of revenue for SDSA. You will see a fundraising recap in this issue with all the details. If you are looking for a great fundraiser for your club, we are seeking bids by Feb. 1 for the 2026 Convention. SDSA other host clubs are ready to help you make it happen!

What made you decide to become an SDSA board

member?

I decided to become an SDSA board member because I wanted to help promote and protect snowmobiling in South Dakota. I enjoy snowmobiling and want to be part of the voice that ensures that it will flourish in the state of South Dakota.

How long have you been an SDSA member?

Where is your favorite place to snowmobile?

Yes, we have our trail put in and ready for the 2024-2025 season. It was tough getting the posts into the ground this year with it being so dry. I am hoping we get some good snow this year for our trails. We have a good group of trail groomers in our club that helps keep our trail maintained.

Do you have a favorite person to take a snowmobile trip with?

My favorite person to take a snowmobile trip with would be my girlfriend of three years. She doesn't have a snowmobile for herself but borrows my dad's sled when she can. Her first time riding a sled was two years ago when I took her on our local trails.

What's your favorite food?

What was your first job, ever?



I don't know how we got to December but here we are. This is always a busy time of year preparing for the state snowmobile convention in Brookings, groomer school in the Black Hills, season opening date right around the corner, trail signing and trail signing corrections on both sides of that state, getting equipment ready to roll and the list goes on. While snow conditions at this time aren't what we would like to see, we have had some snow on both sides of the state that we can build from.



This is also a time where club meetings really ramp up. It's important to keep the face-to-face relationships with snowmobilers in South Dakota,

and club meetings are a great way of keeping everyone on the same page. Let me know when your next meeting is, and I'd be happy to attend to discuss any issues with you. If you feel you or your club members need further training or clarity about the trail signing guidelines, Grant in Aid program, or just the snowmobile program, a club meeting would be a great opportunity to get a clear message across to all members in attendance.

Since December 1st, the crew in the Black Hills is busy placing signs, warming shelters, finish establishing new trails and wrapping a bow on the final product that is the best trail system in the country. Shannon along with his other fulltime staff and seasonal staff do a great job getting the trail system ready for snowmobilers across the country.





having the sled there to get more tickets sold.







To Blade or Not to Blade? (The answer is always to blade.)

Using the blade on a snowcat effectively is crucial for grooming, clearing trails, or leveling terrain. If you didn't learn how to groom by using the blade, don't worry — it's something everyone can pick up with just a few practice runs. Remember the old adage: practice makes perfect. Give yourself a chance, try it out, and you'll probably be surprised how much of a difference it really makes.

The first step it to understand the controls. This is typically a joystick or lever that raises or lowers the blade. A nice feature of all the Prinoth Stage V vehicles is that they all contain the same operating system, which makes going between models effortless, boosting operator confidence. The ergonomic joystick hand rest allows for hours of smooth, comfortable operation.

Here are some tips to keep in mind when using the blade and to help to increase your comfort level with the tool.

- The angle of the blade adjusts (side-to-side movement). Depending on that angle, you can push snow to the side of the trail or straight ahead.
- o For general snow pushing, set the blade angle to direct the snow.
- o For more precise grooming, adjust the angle as needed based on where you want the snow to end up.
- Adjust the blade angle to control the direction of the snow.
- o For wider coverage, angle the blade slightly. This will push the snow to the outside of the blade making the trail a bit wider.
- o For more precise control, keep it straight.
- Tilting the blade up or down allows you to change its pitch. This affects how the snow is cut and moved.
- o Sometimes you'll want a higher angle, allowing the snow to roll inside the blade. Other times, in different snow conditions, you'll use a lower angle to get the snow to roll. This takes a bit of trial and error to figure out.
- Adjust the blade to the desired height, usually slightly above the ground. The blade should glide just over the snow to avoid unnecessary wear or snagging debris that is sticking up on the trail.
- o Gradually lower the blade to make contact with the snow.
- o Avoid dropping it too quickly to prevent sudden resistance or a divot in the trail.
- While grooming, lower the blade, flat position and move slowly to create an even surface.
- o Make multiple passes if needed, adjusting the blade height for consistency.
- o Remember, you can always back up and fix it.
- When clearing trails, adjust the blade angle to push snow to the sides.
- o Ensure you cover the entire width of the trail with each pass.
- o If you encounter rocks, stumps, or other obstacles, raise the blade to avoid damage. Adjust the blade position carefully when maneuvering around these obstacles.
- o Use the tilt control to adjust how the blade interacts with uneven surfaces or obstacles.
- Use smooth and controlled movements to push snow allowing the blade to work efficiently. Let the machine do the work!

Spend time operating the blade in various snow conditions to understand how different settings affect performance. Adjust techniques as needed based on your experience, refine your techniques to improve efficiency and results. By

mastering the use of the blade on your snowcat, you'll enhance your ability to manage snow and maintain trails effectively, whether you're operating in a recreational or professional setting.


